



The field is black with red flames rising from a white sword, and a rainbow which includes all colors of which national flags of the Allies are composed tops the shield. At top is the insignia of the famous British Eighth Army — a gold or yellow Crusader's cross on a white shield. Canadians fighting with the 8th wear this insignia.










TRACTOR TOGGED OUT FOR WINTER

PINCERS POSSIBILITY



Anticipating Allied capture and consolidation of French Mediterranean ports, armchair strategists see Anticipating Annea capture and consolidation of French Mediterranean ports, armician strategists see interesting possibilities of a surprise pincers movement, as diagrammed on map above, that might spell quick doom for Germans in northern Italy. Left arm of pincers could thrust eastward through Alpine passes on to broad plains above Po river; right arm would require amphibious invasion on east coast of Adriatic. Success of movement would trap Nazis in northern Italy, force their surrender or flight through Brenner Pass which is at mercy of Allied bombers.
