The platform elevation of this new station of the future is illustrative of the use of glass to cover light, airy public rooms, and the decorative veneer of field stone and fireproofed concrete boards over the concrete structure.

Gone are the dimly-lit waiting rooms and dull painted walls of railway stations. The new Canadian National Railway station is the last word in appointments and travellers' conveniences, and looks as modern as the newest streamline locomotive. Specially designed by John Schofield, Chief Architect of the Canadian National System, the station building is 74 feet long, 24 feet wide and 12 feet high, and its streamline appearance is the most revolutionary when compared with the old, standard type of station. A three-foot dado of field stone covers the hidden concrete wall structure and huge glass windows continue the remainder of the wall space to the

overhanging, seven-foot-wide roof projection over the 700-foot long platform. The ticket office bay also is glass on three sides above the field stone base assuring the public rooms a flood of sunlight. The baggage and express rooms on the opposite end of the station continue the exterior board finish which features the street corner of the waiting room above the station. The interior lighting is equally modern. J. F. Pringle, vice-president and general manager of the Central Region, announced that the first of the new station will be constructed at Midland, Ont., to replace the former wooden structure destroyed by fire.

## THE WAR - WEEK - Commentary on Current Events

### "A Definite, Complete and Decisive Victory - End of War In Sight"

The job of presenting a complete picture of France today is too much for even the most gifted reporters and the most expert map makers, says the New York Times. The reporters can dip here and there into the clouds and smoke that have been swirling over the country. The map makers can lay out with lines and shadings the expanding area of Allied control, the communiques reveal such of the armies' movements as will not enlighten the enemy. General Montgomery, in a characteristic burst of enthusiasm, declares that there has been a "definite, complete and decisive victory" and asserts that "the end of the war is in sight." Prime Minister Churchill, more cautiously, refuses to "predict an early end of the war" but will not "guarantee against it ending sooner than we had allowed ourselves to hope."

#### Nazi Disasters

The details almost defy generalization: the bulk of General von Kluge's Seventh Army being chewed up in the Argentan-Falaise pocket; elements of the German Fifteenth Army trying to recross the Seine under air bombardment; the German Sixth Army, moving to turn this new escape route into a new trap; Paris outflanked, with resistance forces in the city growing bolder every hour and Allied tanks apparently avoiding entrance only in order to prevent the city's destruction; Allied warships silencing the forts of Toulon and French troops in the outskirts of the port; an Allied column from the south reported one-third of the way to Lyons; Allied cruisers shelling Bayonne; Nazis and their sympathizers pouring into Spain over the international bridge at Hendaye as did the refugees from the Nazis four years ago; the French Forces of the Interior active over one-third of the area of France.

#### Two Bright Facts

Two facts stand out brightly in all this apparent confusion. One is that the Germans, not only outnumbered and outwitted but out-generated and outthought, are in great danger of losing the best

part and perhaps the greater part of the six-million divisions they were reported to have in western Europe on D-day. If the present pressure is kept up they will find it difficult indeed to stand on any line inside the French frontiers, and they may have to abandon Norway and the Low Countries. Nor do they dare, in spite of the communiques revealing success on the Baltic front, withdraw any large number of troops from the East. The second fact is that the moment the Nazis hold western at any point, there is a popular uprising. This is clearly evident in France, and that it will occur elsewhere. The best that any outnumbered Nazi occupation force can hope for is to be taken prisoner. The best that the Quilings and lesser collaborators can hope for is a trial in due process.

#### Time Hitler's Only Friend

It does not become us to forget, however, that the Nazi realm has been brought to this stage, as Mr. Churchill predicted, by blood, sweat and tears. Boys of the Allied nations are suffering wounds and death in this moment of victory as they did in the less hopeful days. At this supreme crisis it is for us to support them with work as well as prayers. Time is now Hitler's only friend. The home front must stand with the fighting men in denying it to him.

### Advance Warning Of Earthquakes?

It may soon be possible to give advance warning of earthquakes. An experimental network of stations, each equipped with apparatus that automatically registers the slightest variation of the earth's surface, is to be set up in the southeastern part of the Tadzhikistan (Central Asia) by the Academy of Sciences of the Soviet Union.

It is hoped that these stations will give warning of earthquakes several days before they occur by registering abnormal movements of the rocks of the earth's crust.

## How Can I?

Q. How can I bake green peppers, apples, or tomatoes so that they will keep their shapes?

A. Put them in muffin pans. They are easy to remove and will keep their shape better than if cooked close together in a baking tin.

Q. How can I prevent having lumps in the tablecloth?

A. There will be no lump in the center of the tablecloth when it is put on the table after laundering. If it is folded three times lengthwise before it is folded across.

Q. How can I prevent warping of wooden tubs, wine barrels, or buckets?

A. Do not leave them empty for any length of time or they will warp and finally fall apart. To prevent shrinkage, fill the bottom with about two or three inches of water.

Q. How can I keep the iron frying pan or pot roaster from rusting?

A. It will not rust if it is thoroughly dry before putting it away. Place the pan over a lighted gas burner until it dries.

Q. How can I remove discolorations from the interiors of bottles and other glassware?

A. Fill nearly full with the following mixture, let stand for several hours, shaking occasionally, then empty and rinse thoroughly with clean hot water and ammonia: Warm water, one tablespoonful baking soda, and a handful of potato parings, pea beans, or buckshot.

## To Open Cigarette Bank In France

A cigarette bank, similar to the one serving troops in the Mediterranean, will be established at once for Canadian forces in Normandy and British in the Post-office announced. Air-mailed orders will be filled by drawing on big reserves built up over the last few months by bulk shipments.

Cigarette gifts will continue to be ordered by individuals through the local tobacconist or direct from the tobacco companies, said the announcement. The tobacco companies prepare labels on receipt of orders, complete with postage and particulars, each label covering one parcel of 300 cigarettes. The Postoffice then takes over. The labels are recorded and flow overseas to the reserve tobacco

## U. S. Builds Nearly 50,000 Landing Craft

The United States Navy is nearing the halfway mark in its goal of a 100,000 landing-craft fleet for amphibious warfare.

It announced that to date 1,624,629 tons, representing 48,257 landing-craft, have been produced.

More than a million workers have been engaged in the program. At present about 4,000 prime contractors and 30,000 subcontractors are engaged in the work with landing-craft being assembled at seventy-four shipyards.

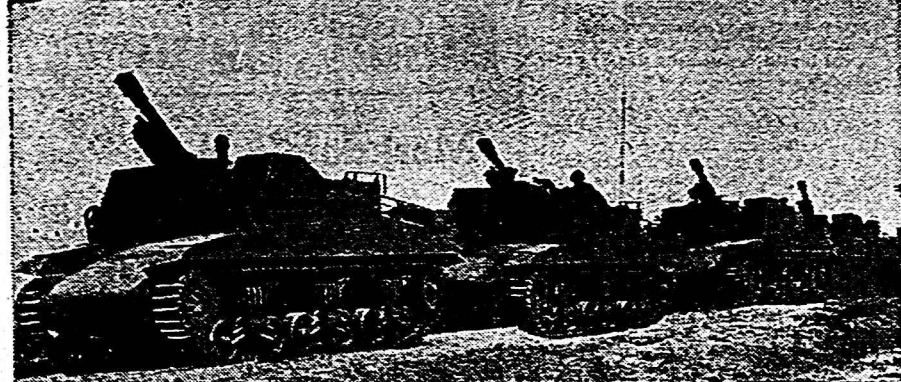

Here are two emblems worn by some soldiers of the Canadian Army Overseas, which World War II has produced and made famous. The field is black with red flames rising from a white sword and a rainbow which includes all colors of which national flags of the Allies are composed - tops the shield. ## 'CAMERA' ACTION



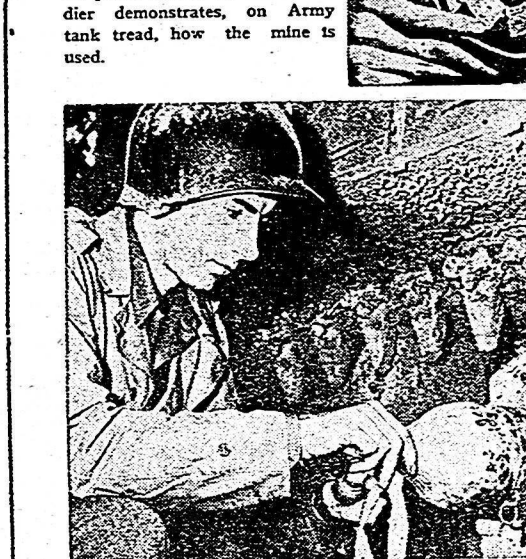

## NAZIS UP TO DEADLY TRICKS



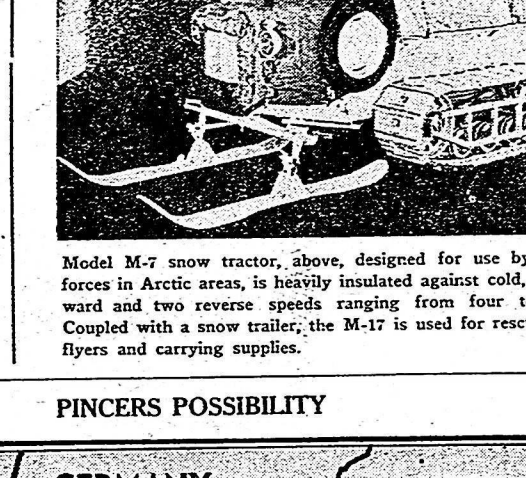
These photos show two of the tricky new mines Germans are using in Italy. Two-part mine pictured above is anti-personnel weapon. Wooden peg is driven into ground, mine is placed on it, above ground, and cord tied between two mines. When trip cord is disturbed, it pulls the pins and both mines explode simultaneously. Other two pictures show a new anti-tank mine, also used against other vehicles. Its bottle-shaped shell has open bottom, in which there is the electro-magnet seen in picture at right. This enables mines to adhere to any steel part. In photo below, an Allied soldier demonstrates, on Army tank tread, how the mine is used.

## TRACTOR TOGGED OUT FOR WINTER



Model M-7 snow tractor, above, designed for use by the armed forces in Arctic areas, is heavily insulated against cold, has six forward and two reverse speeds ranging from four to 41 m.p.h. Coupled with a snow trailer, the M-17 is used for rescuing downed flyers and carrying supplies.

## PINCERS POSSIBILITY



Anticipating Allied capture and consolidation of French Mediterranean ports, armchair strategists see interesting possibilities of a surprise pincers movement, as diagrammed on map above, that might spell quick doom for Germans in northern Italy. Left arm of pincers could thrust eastward through Alpine passes on to the Po plains above. Right arm would require amphibious invasion on east coast of Adriatic. Success of movement would trap Nazis in northern Italy, force their surrender or flight through Brenner Pass which is mercy of Allied bombers.
