In the afternoon members of the concert party will entertain the people on the grounds. This party includes their leader, Ernie Barnes, noted pianist; Ted Rust, Canada's Edgar Bergen; Joan Cousins, juvenile dancer; Rudy Spratt, ace banjoiist, and Al Dunlop, accordionist and singer.

This year again, the school children of the district will be admitted free. Tickets have been sent out to the local schools for distribution.
