Mrs. John Johnston, widow of the late John Johnston, passed away at the home of her nephew, Mr. Ira Madill, in Holland on Wednesday, Oct. 11th. The funeral takes place from the Madill home on Friday with service in Harlawy Church at 2:30 o'clock.

### Mrs. S. A. Morrison

One of the most esteemed and prominent club and church women in Grey County and a former resident of Markdale, Mrs. S. A. Morrison, wife of the former East Grey Public School Inspector, passed away at her late residence in Meaford on Monday. She succumbed to a long illness and was in her 79th year.

The deceased was formerly Jessie Macdonald Mine and she was born on January 11th, 1866, at Guelph, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Mine. In her childhood the family moved to Benluch Township, where they were well-known residents for many years. As a young girl, Mrs. Morrison attended Collegiate at Guelph and graduated from the Normal School at Toronto. At the time of her marriage to S. A. Morrison in 1906, she had been teaching in school at Southampton for a number of years and was very highly regarded in the profession.

Throughout her married life, the deceased was of great assistance to her husband in his work as teacher and school inspector. She maintained a very active interest in all educational matters and lent great encouragement in the promotion of school fairs, inspiring the teachers and boys and girls in this work.

For a number of years after their marriage they resided at Markdale and other points where Mr. Morrison was employed. About 17 years ago they moved to Meaford, which was Mr. Morrison's headquarters during his term as East Grey Inspector. Mrs. Morrison exerted a lasting influence in church and temperance circles as well as being an able officer and speaker in club circles. She took a prominent part in the Grey County and also local Women's Christian Temperance Union. Formerly a member of the Presbyterian Church and later the United Church she sang in the choir of these churches. In the United Church she was an active member of the Women's Association.

She also taught Sunday School and took great pride and pleasure in her work. She was a member of the Georgian Chapter of the I.O.G.E. and the Meaford Branch of the Women's Institute. An able historian, when the Grey County History was published, she was asked to compile the history of the township of Benluch where she spent her childhood.

Besides the bereaved husband, one sister, the last of the pioneer family of eleven, Mrs. E. J. Ewing, of Buffalo, N.Y., mourns. Mrs. Ewing's funeral and interment at Mrs. Morrison's bedside at the time of her passing.
