Making Hay

Making hay while the sun shine Making hay winie the sun sinies is not the only time farmers can now cure hay, says The Christian Science Monitor. Experiments begun by the University of Tennessee and the Tennessee Valley Authority have proved, to the satisfaction of pioneering farmers in Indiana at least, that the several kinds of hay can be cured in a new type of




