By an order signed on August 15th, 1944, by the undersigne Minister of Labour under authority of National Selective Service Mobilization Regulations, 1944: 1. Commencing August 22nd, 1944, every employer is required to check the documents held by each newly engaged male employee, within 7 days of the employee's engagement, to determine if such employee possesses documents to show that he is in good standing under National Selective Service Mobilization Regulations, 1944 (that is, in relation to the Military Call-up);

documents he has not checked before, and to report to the Registrar for his Mobilization at once on any such employee found not to possess documents as referred to;

4. Any male employee here referred to, is required by the Regulations to present his documents to his employer for purposes of inspection;

INCLUDES ALSO ANY FARMER MALE PERSON WORKING FOR HIM;

3. Every employer is required similarly to check the documents held by each male employee who fails to comply employee now working for him, whose






