For the moment the German counter offensive on the Western front has driven into the background news of that underlying struggle of ideas which has been coming out into the open recently in Greece and the other liberated countries of Europe. All round the world there are signs that this battle of ideas is coming to a climax. If we don't watch out, we may be caught just as unprepared for this war as we were for the war of arms in 1939. There is the same evidence of blindness and unreality now as there was then. We did everything in the thirties but introduce the material and moral rearmament that was needed. To-day there is talk about new systems, economic adjustments and so on, but these are all fundamentally materialistic weapons with which to stem the unrush of materialistic ideas.
