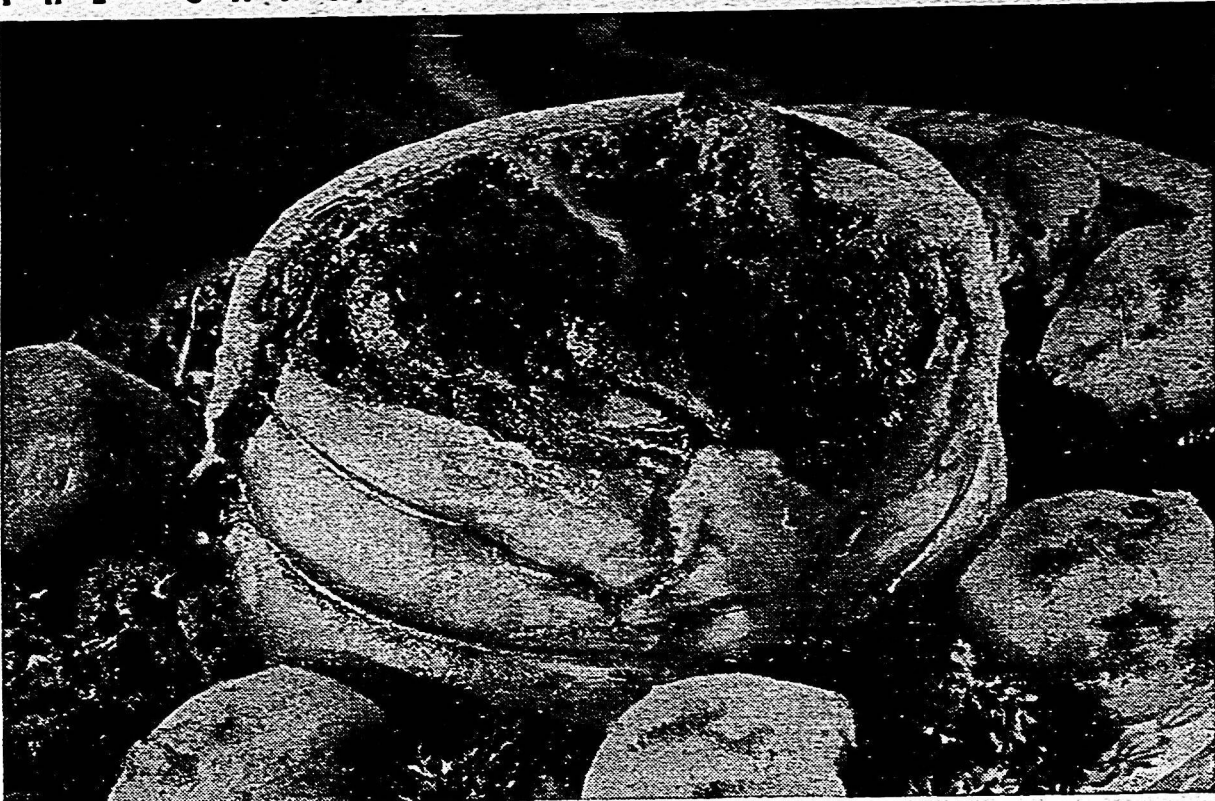

Coupons now valid are Butter 90 to 111, Sugar 45 to 60, and Preserves 33 to 37 and P1.

Strawberry Prices
Date at which the season prices of strawberries will be reduced has been set back, according to an announcement of the Prices Board. Owing to the lateness of the crop the drop in prices in Western Ontario which had been scheduled to take place on June 26th, will now not take place until June 30th.

Ration Coupons Collected Every Four Weeks

Coupons for rationed foods will now be collected every four weeks by those operating summer hotels, boarding houses and summer tourist homes, according to an announcement of the regional ration office of the Prices Board. The previous system was to collect coupons from residents of these establishments every two weeks. Now it will not be necessary for any guest in either summer hotels, boarding houses, or summer tourist camps to present ration books if their stay is less than one month.
