





That Ex-Servicemen Are Big

thought uppermost in the minds of almost 80% of Canada's ex-service men and women, interviewing of ficers of the Veterans Affairs De ertment have discovered. Of tho terviewed in June almost 23% expect reinstatement in old jobs, 12.5% have new jobs waiting, 33% are hoping for employment, 6% are returning to their own businesses and 2.5% plan to return to their

To date a total of \$1,275,680 has been paid out to veterans in re-establishment credits. \$1,596,394 has quisition, repair or modernization of a home, indicating commitments in this field of some \$20,000,000 when all is paid out.

An even greater amount, \$1,616,-

456 has been released to veterans for the purchase of furniture and household equipment. As the reestablishment credit may only be authorized for this purpose on the basis of two dollars credit for one dollar cash put up by the veteran, this represents an expenditure of \$2,424,684 in this field since last January when the War Service Grants Act came into force.

These two groups account for credits authorized in the first six months of 1945.
