The principal vine crops to include in the average garden will be cucumbers, squash, pump-kins and melons. Early varieties of encumbers will mature in two months. While it is distinctly a warm-weather crop. extreme heat of midsummer in some locations is too severe.

Farmers Combine

To Do Their Buying We do not advocate that farming should be in the hands of a few big organizations, but there is no reason why adjacent groups of farmers should not combine to do their buying in the same way that co-operative groups combine to do their selling, says the St. Thomas Times -Journal.

There are regions in Canada where from 12 to 20 farmers have got together under this system. Instead of each man buying his own equipment, his own seed, fertilizers and other needs, they buy as a unit. By co-operative efforts they get their seeding, plowing and other work done at the right seasons, and by buying in quantities they get their supplies

Thus instead of hundreds of thousands of farmers working as individual units at high individual cost which prevents them getting what they regard as economical prices for their produce, they would reduce overhead costs and fortunate city people to pay tinually higher prices out of fixed

United States Government 100d officials, questioned on what the individual can do to help hungry millions in Europe and Asia, made a few suggestions for critizens. Here they are:

1. If you're a housewife:

Never throw a piece of bread or Acter throw a piece of oreast of a teaspoonful of fat away. Make sure the garbage consists only of bones, eggshells and the inedable parts of fruits and vegetalles.
Don't overeat.

Never over-serve a guest. Don't fry meats, poultry, fish. Rake boil or stew them. Serve home-made salad dressing


