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How Can I? By Anne Ashley

Q. How should the oven be cooled?
A. When the oven door is opened, after the oven has been very hot, it often cools too quickly. But instead of doing this, if a pan of cold water is placed in the oven, it will lower the temperature gradually.

Q. Should anything be done to a brass kettle that has not been in use for sometime, before using it again?
A. Yes. Wash it with salt and vinegar before using.

Q. How can I prevent fat from splattering on the stove?
A. It will not splatter when frying if a little salt is added to it.

Q. How can I make a good polish for the stove?
A. Mix equal parts of a good stove polish with kerosene and turpentine until the consistency of cream. Apply when the stove or range is slightly warm. Then polish with a rough cloth. This also prevents rust.

Q. How can I facilitate the pulling of threads from linen?
A. Before pulling threads, rub a damp cloth along the line where the thread is to be pulled. The thread will pull easily while the cloth is damp.

Q. What should be used for oiling the meat grinder?
A. If the meat grinder requires oiling, use a drop or two of glycerine. This will act as a lubricant and will prevent any disagreeable taste or smell.
