EGGS

- 1 Eggs must be spotlessly clean.
- 2 Eggs must be kept cool—around 40 degrees Fahrenheit. (Possibly keep in basement.)
- 3 Particular care must be given to the feed of laying hens. Too many roots cause dark yolks—hence B Grade.
- 4 Market eggs regularly—twice a week if possible.

Most of the eggs are now being exported. In order to hold this market we must supply good eggs. Try the above suggestions for more "egg money."

The regular meeting of Euphrasia Council met on February 5th, 1947, with all members present and the Reeve in the chair. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

Haines - Rennie - That the Reeve and Clerk be authorized to petition the Department of Highways for subsidy on special snowploughing for winter of 1946 - 47. — Carried.

Sewell - Rennie - That the County Treasurer be paid \$6.16 arrears of taxes for 1945 paid in error to Bank of Toronto. Markdale. — Carried.

Sewell - Taylor - That the Treasurer receive the following amounts: Main-tainer rental, Geo. Wiley, \$8.50; Fred Bryer, \$3.75; Jas. McCrabb, \$7.50; Jas. Wiley, 75c; Jas. Payne, \$3.00; Co-op Creamery, \$42.00; Roy Kirkpatrick, \$9.00; Hall rent, \$50.00; Deviation Snow Club, \$50.00. — Carried.
