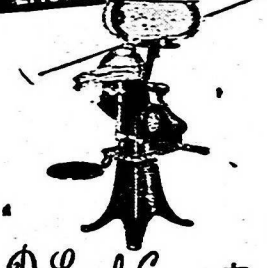

EGGS
We are most anxious that you receive the best possible grade for your eggs so that you will receive the most money for them. In order to obtain a higher grade, your co-operation is necessary.
1 Eggs must be spotlessly clean.
2 Eggs must be kept cool—around 40 degrees Fahrenheit. (Possibly keep in basement.)
3 Particular care must be given to the feed of laying hens. Too many roots cause dark yolks—hence B Grade.
4 Market eggs regularly—twice a week if possible.
Most of the eggs are now being exported. In order to hold this market we must supply good eggs. Try the above suggestions for more "egg money."
