Grey County Council Has Busy Session

In the report of the Agricultural committee, three resolutions and several grants were recommended, and a motion passed that Agricultural Representative T. S. Cooper form an organization to conduct a county elimination match, to decide which boys go to the provincial plowing match.

The resolutions included a petition to the government: to hold all possible feed grain and make it available to Eastern Canadian feeders of livestock at a reasonable price, because of unfavorable weather conditions this spring.

It was resolved that all meat animals should be bought by the processors on a graded basis, and that carcasses be sold to consumers on a similar graded basis, and thirdly, resolved that the additional \$2 advance in hog prices coming on September 1st become effective at once.

A deputation on warble fly control congratulated the council on its purchase of a new spraying machine, which may be used either to spray weeds or to control warble flies. The chairman of the committee and the agricultural representative were appointed to prepare a by-law enforcing the regulations to stamp out the warble fly menace.

The consultative Committee on the high school districts in the county brought in a report favouring larger school areas, if and when feasible, but such such time as the Hope Rural Commission has reported, and the action of the Department of Education has been indicated, with regard to secondary education, further action will be deferred.

The County tax rate for the year 1948 was set at 8 1/4 mills, but since it is based on the new equalized assessment, it is expected to raise as much money as last year when the rate was one mill higher.

A by-law to restrict and regulate the cutting of forest trees, and a second by-law to appoint a tree conservation commission, was recommended to the County Council by the reforestation committee, and passed by the latter with a single amendment. Briefly, the by-law restricts the cutting of certain species of healthy well-formed trees that do not attain to specified measurements, without special permission from the Trees Conservation Committee of Grey County. The by-law does not, however, interfere with the right of landowners to cut trees for his own domestic use. Over 140,000 trees have been planted on the Grey County Forest this year.

Because of the heavy expenditures last winter for snow removal, the only new construction on roads this year will be the rebuilding of three bridges, it was announced by Grey County Road Committee's report who presented estimates of road expenditure of \$138,000.

Five boys who will be given expenses for a two-day trip to the Royal Winter Fair in November are: Keith Freeman, Markdale; Robt. Ellis, Meaford; Herbert Wodehouse, Kimberley; Wally Ritchie, Shallow Lake and Thos. Firth, Durham.

MIX PAINT WELL

"In doing paint work at home, one reason why the job does not turn out as well as it might have done is that the paint has not been thoroughly mixed before starting. To realize the importance of thorough mixing of paint, the user has to keep in mind that he is working with a complex material consisting of oil, pigment, dryer, and thinner. The proportions of each in any can of paint is a matter of careful technical measurement, so that the resulting paint can do its mixture becomes good paint again only after they are completely blended together again before using.

Stirring is the most common method of recapturing the perfect blending of the materials, but it must be done thoroughly. A few quick stirs after the can is opened will not do.
