Glengly Council

The Council met on Saturday, Sept. 6th according to the adjournment. The members were all present. The minutes of the August meeting and a special meeting were read and adopted. Communications were read from the Department of Municipal Affairs re clerk's return for 1947 and application forms for 1 mill subsidy. Department of Highways acknowledged a copy of supplementary by-law for a further expenditure of \$3,000 on roads in 1947. Road Voucher No. 9, amounting to \$21075, was presented for payment. Glengly's share of hospital accounts amounting to \$85.25 was ordered paid to the County. The Markdale Agricultural Society was given a grant of \$30.00-\$10.00 to be used for school children's work. The treasurer was authorized to pay all other accounts amounting to \$167.96.
The Council decided to put in a fill at Fred Eagles gate on Concession 6, as the water has covered the road at this point. The Reeve and Clerk were authorized to sign a petition for the interim payment of the Statutory Grant, on expenditures made on roads in 1947. By-law to appoint an acting Medical Officer of Health for the Township, was filled in with the name of Dr. D. M. Young and passed.
The Council adjourned to meet on October 4th for general business.

Rennie—Sewell, that by-law No. 10 appointing J. H. Beatty, as Township Engineer, be read a first time.—Carried.
Sewell—Rennie, that by-law No. 10 be read a second and third time and finally passed.—Carried.
