The "old College spirit"—like a lot of other spirits—seems to be suffering from a bit too much dilution.

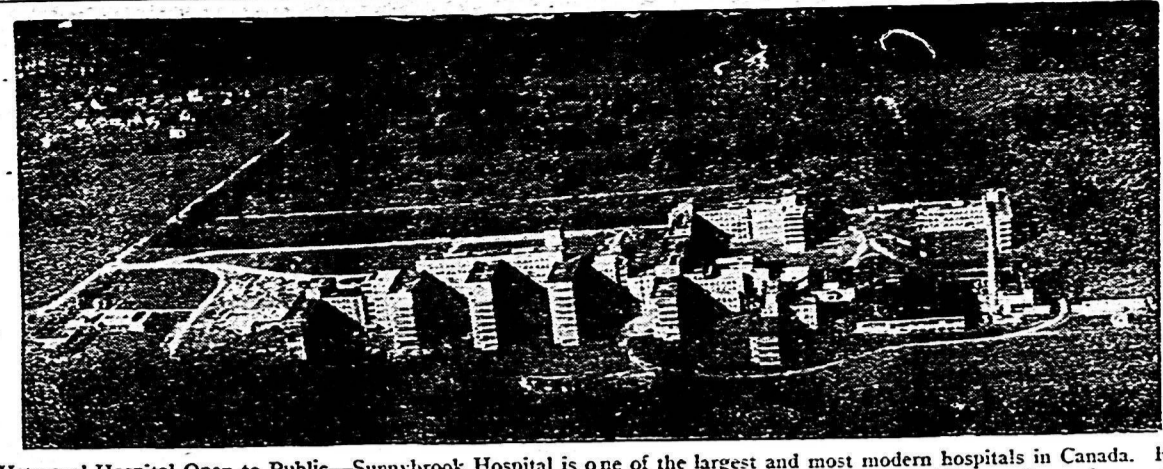

Seventy Years Only Half Span of Life

Want to live to 140? You may, say leading scientists who believe that man's natural span of life actually is from 120 to 140 years, says "The Encyclopedia Americana." Politman, a surgeon who lived from 1685 to 1825, dying at 140, would become intoxicated nightly. Brawn, a hard-drinking Irishman who lived to 120, had an inscription placed on his tombstone stating "he was always drunk." Excessive smokers and coffee drinkers are also found among the centenarians. Ross, who won a longevity prize in 1896 when he turned 104, was an inveterate smoker. A Mme. Lazennac, who died at 104, smoked a pipe since her youth. Elizabeth Durieux, who lived to 114, drank 40 cups of coffee every day. Dr. Voronoff warns that no one should conclude from such examples that abuses of alcohol, tobacco or coffee have no prejudicial influence on health. The ill effects of overindulgence are too well known, but these few examples are cited merely to prove that the secret of longevity cannot be found in sobriety.

Well Insulated, Well Ventilated Farm Buildings

Methods of planned insulation are being more generally adopted not only for the farm home itself but for all animal shelters on the farm. Insulated homes are more comfortable; they cost less to heat in the winter, and during hot summer days they are more easily kept cool.

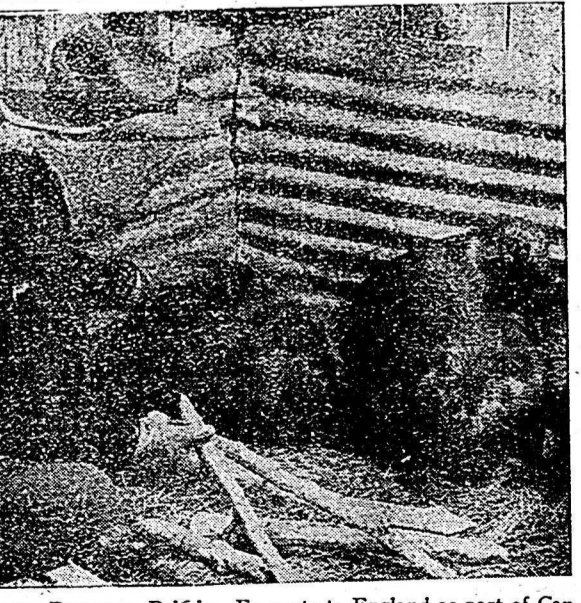
Live-stock buildings are seldom heated, animal heat being relied upon to keep the building comfortable. Such buildings, says G. B. Harrison, Dominion Experimental Station, Swift Current, Sas., should be insulated to conserve this animal heat as much as possible. Concrete floors will be warmer if they are built over a cinder fill. Cinders have a greater insulating value than gravel, stone, or the earth over which a concrete floor is often poured.

Trouble from Moisture
 The walls of farm buildings may be filled with insulating material, such as wood shavings, sunflower seed hulls, or some of the commercial insulating materials such as vermiculite or mineral wool. The space between the joists of the ceiling may be partially filled with these, or the loft may be filled with hay or straw.

If moisture finds its way into the insulation in walls or ceilings, trouble may be expected from condensation. Silts and studs may start decaying. To prevent water vapour passing through to the cold outer layers of the insulation, a vapour-proof material should be used on the warm side of the wall. Two coats of an oil paint will give fairly good results. Better results will be obtained by using vapour-proof paper, a specialty which is sold by most lumber dealers.

Ventilation Important
 A tight, well-insulated building is easier to ventilate than an uninsulated drafty structure. If live stock or poultry are to be profitable, their health should be safeguarded by properly built, well-insulated buildings. Old buildings may be insulated and made weatherproof by filling the space between the studs of frame buildings with shavings or mineral wool. This can be done by removing a board near the ceiling or under the eaves. In some cases, mineral wool is blown in with an engine-driven blower. Stone, concrete, brick, or frame walls may be covered with ordinary plaster or with a Portland cement plaster. This would be particularly suitable for dairy barns, milk houses, and other places where sanitation is very important.
