Golden Text-How beautiful upor the mountains are the feet of him that bringeth good tidings, that publisheth peace; that bringeth good tidings of good that publish eth salvation; that saith unto Zion, Thy God Reigneth!—Isaiah 52:7. Paul very definitely preached

Jesus Christ and Him Crucified. Book reviews or discourses on political philosophies were not hi line. He presented the "word of faith" to the people. The people in turn, must believe and confess Salvation is not of works but of faith. This belief is not only an intellectual assent to the truths of the Cospel but a personal approp-riation of its benefits. It is a belief "unto righteousness." Then it is the privilege of the Christian and his express duty to confess Christ before men. A professed Christian spent the winter in the lumber camp. 

cake flour; 2½ teaspoons double-acting baking powder; ½ teaspoon salt; ½ cup butter or other short-

acting baking powder; % teaspoon salt; % cup butter or other shortening; 1 cup sugar; 2 eggs, well beaten; % cup milk; 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift together three times. Cream butter, add sugar gradually, and cream together until light and fluffy. Add eggs and beat well. Add flour, alternately with milk, a small amount at a time, beating after each addition until smooth. Add vanilla. Bake in two greased & inch layer pans in moderate oven (375°F.) 25 to 30 minutes. When cool, cover bottom layer with sliced bananas. Over this pour your favorite boiled or 7 Minute Frosting. Place second layer on top and cover top and sides of cake with remaining frosting to which nuts have been added.


