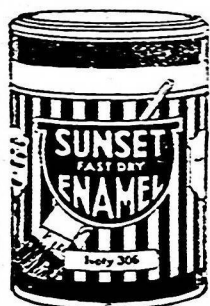

GRAIN MUST BE TESTED TO BE ADVERTISED AS SEED
Those with grain for sale are kindly reminded that it may not be advertised as "seed grain" unless it has been tested by the Provincial Seeds Branch and a Certificate issued as to germination, etc. Otherwise, the grain may be offered for sale as cleaned grain but not as seed grain. These regulations are designated to protect the seller and grower alike and to encourage the sowing of certified seed. As "The Farmer's Advocate" says: "It cannot be denied that some progress had been made during recent years in the selection of seed, in the choice of varieties, in seed cleaning, and particularly in the production of registered and certified seed stocks. However, there is still a long way to go. The Ontario Crop Improvement Association has a big work ahead."

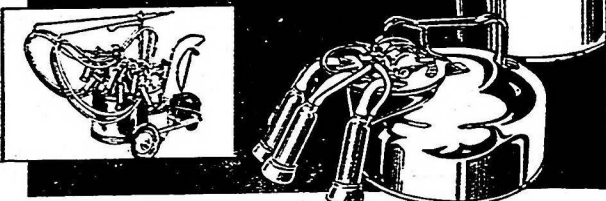
