Some Information About Canned Foods

Mies Margaret E. Smith, Direc tor of the Health Langue's Nutri common questions concerning commercially canned foods—

Is it safe to leave food in the nenamelled can in which it come ence the can has been opened? Yes, if it is kept cool and covered However, if the color begins to fad or if the taste depreciate: the food

What is the reason for the chang of taste and color in some canne products and not in others? Sometimes microscopic openin are left when the large steel plate

from which cans are made, ar coated with tin. The acid juices fruits penetrate these tiny pores and form iron and tin salts. There are not enough of these iron and tin salts to be injurious to healt! but they may be present in sufficient amounts to give the juices metallic taste, more so once the ter is a chemical and when it re-acts with metals, different substances form and the color changes Why are not all cans enamelle to prevent such changes taking

It costs more to produce en amelled steel plate. Enamelled cans are used only when the other type of can changes the color of affects the taste of the packed prod net-that is before the can hi been opened.

What is the meaning of "vacm·packed?" Sometimes food is placed in the can without or with very little liquid. The can is then sealed with vacuum sealing machine which withdraws the air without heating. After sealing, the contents of cans are processed.

Should food be heated in cansa

It is better to remove the food from the can before heating it, but unopened cans may be heated in boiling water. However, be sure the water does not evaporate, be pressure in the can to cause it to

Is it necessary to complete the cooking of commercially canned vegetables after removing them from the can?

No, vegetables prepared by modern canning methods are thoroughly cooked. However, canned foods should be well heated, and it is advisable to drain the liquid from the can into another container and heat it to the boiling point before adding the solid product. In this way the tissues are more quickly heated than if solid and liquid were
