**Causes for Change In Butterfat Test**

There is a decrease in fat content during the warmer months of the year and an increase during the colder months. The tests are generally lowest in June and July and highest in December and January. A low fat percentage in the Spring and early Summer is thought to be due to a combination of the higher temperature and the higher humidity rather than to the turning of the cows out to pasture. The variation in fat content, due to seasonal changes, is more pronounced when the cows freshen in early spring. This is true because the cows will be in their lowest testing period of lactation when the depression due to high heat and high humidity of summer arrives.
