The last chance to avoid an accident usually rests with the motorist. Highway officials have issued a timely reminder to watch out for children whenever there is any possibility of their being on or near the streets. Children act impulsively and may dart out from behind parked cars, so the motorist must be prepared for unexpected actions in unexpected places, especially during the summer months.


