### CARE AND MAINTENANCE OF LATE HATCHED PULLETS

There is a tendency during the nice summer weather to unconsciously neglect the pullets hatched during the late spring or early summer season. This is the time of the year that the younger pullets should be given every opportunity to develop into well matured birds before the cooler fall weather arrives. If range shelters are not available and the pullets roost in colony houses, be sure to provide plenty of ventilation. Teach the pullets to roost at an early age, which in turn will prevent the birds from crowding in the corners at night.

Under most circumstances it is advisable to feed the later hatched pullets starting mash for the first eight weeks and then to gradually change to a growing mash. Sufficient mash should be placed in the hoppers to insure that mash will be available throughout the entire day. The pullets will appreciate a fresh supply each day. Grain can also be fed in hoppers or scattered on the ground once a day. If it appears that the pullets are eating more grain than mash, it may be necessary to limit the amount of grain that the birds receive.

It is a good idea to place the feed hoppers a short distance from the pen and to move them periodically. This encourages the birds to range over a larger area of ground. During the middle of the day, the pullets will seek shelter in the pen from the hot sun and an extra feed hopper filled with mash, in the house would mean that the birds would have an opportunity to consume more feed. A supply of fresh clean water is a must at all times.

The pullets should have access to good range pasture. If the present location does not provide suitable pasture, move the pullets to one of the fields where the hay has been removed and the succulent nutritious second growth has started to appear. Keep the pasture short and if necessary mow the part where the pullets range once or oftener. It will be noticed that the pullets will range over a larger area if the pasture is left reasonably short. If for any reason the pullets must be confined, supply as much green feed as possible.

Inspect the birds and the pens periodically for the presence of mites. The little creatures will be found in the day time hiding under the roosts or in cracks or crevices and at night they migrate to the birds. Pullet infested with mites will appear dull and unthrifty. A simple means of control is to cover the roosts and any cracks with used car oil, thinned by the addition of some coal oil. This mixture can be applied by means of a brush. After the first application, inspect the pens in about two weeks and if necessary apply the oil again.

Do not neglect the late-hatched pullets at this time of year. The lack of good range pasture can be made much easier by taking full advantage of what Mother Nature has to offer during the summer months.

### To Refuse Hydro When Heat Wasted

Heaters Without Thermostats Not Forbidden, but Will Not Be Supplied With Power  
No electricity will be supplied to hot water heaters installed in the future which lack thermostatic control and insulation, under a power conservation regulation approved by the Ontario Cabinet.

Other regulations submitted to the Cabinet by the Hydro Electric Power Commission dealing with such matters as restricted store lighting, etc., will be dealt with by the Cabinet this week.

Provincial Secretary Roland Michener said, "Heaters lacking thermostatic control and insulation will not be acceptable. There is nothing to stop the installation of this type of hot water heater, but power will not be supplied to them."

Robt. H. Saunders, Commission Chairman, expressed the hope that the regulation will become effective immediately.

"It will mean not only a saving in power but also a saving in dollars to the consumer when heaters are thermostatically controlled and insulated," said Mr. Saunders.
