James Alexander Dillon, a native of Rockby, Ontario, and a brother of John R. Dillon of Markdale, died on November 11th, at his home in Lashburn, Saskatchewan. He had gone to Lashburn 26 years ago where he conducted a general store under the name of Dillon Bros. He was 63 years of age. Besides his wife, he is survived by one son, Wilfred, of Los Angeles, two daughters, Betty (Mrs. McFashon), of Winnipeg, and Margaret (Mrs. McFashon), of Winnipeg. Four brothers also survive: Ed of Collingwood, Matt of Thornbury, Jack of Markdale, and Wally of Seneca. A sister and a brother predeceased him.

Funeral services were held on Sunday afternoon, November 14th, in the United Church, Lashburn, were largely attended and impressive rites of the Masonic order were conducted at the graveside. Burial was made at Lashburn.

"The late Mr. Dillon," states The Markdale Standard, "was a known figure in the life of the community. He had served many years on the council of the Ontario Creamery Co., and also served on the board of the Lashburn Community Hall. His great interest in the young sports world of the community and he did yeoman service among the young people, helping them in what ever way he could. He was an ardent ball fan and many years have been spent in the company of the ball club. He was a kindly and friendly disposition and was always willing to help anyone who was in trouble. His place will be hard to fill in the life of the community."

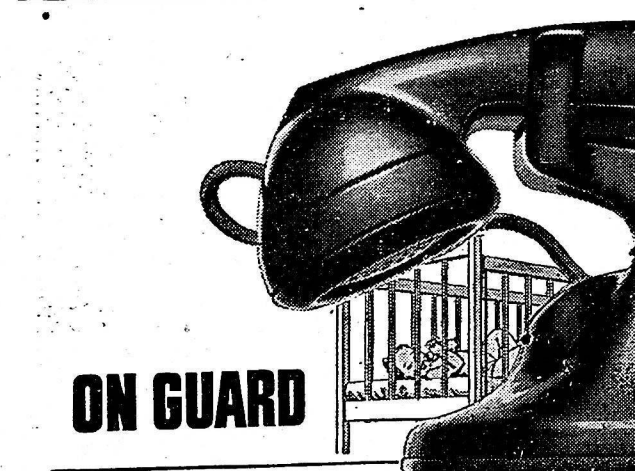
