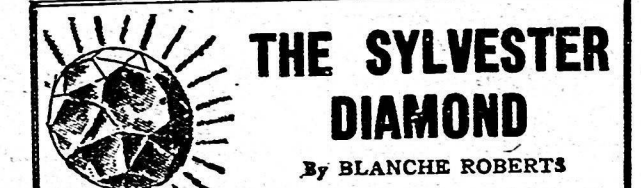

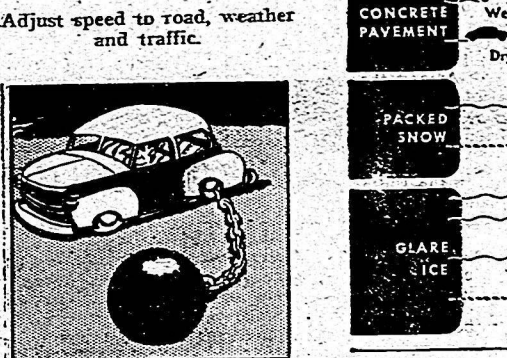
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How To Do It

TABLE TALKS

Just the other day I was talking to a young chap who was leaving for another town to start a new position. "I wish I could go along with you to see how you get on," he said. "Mother made a lemon pie that was about a foot across and six inches deep. Add half cup of cold water to cornstarch gradually and blend in a little of the hot liquid. Return to cook until all is slightly thickened. Serve with mashed potatoes or cooled rice. Makes six servings—and goes extra well on a chilly day."

Lemon Clifton Pie
1 nine-inch pie shell
1 tablespoon gelatin
1/2 cup cold water
4 egg yolks
1 cup sugar
3/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup lemon juice

Cracker-Jack
2 cups molasses
1 tablespoon butter
One-eighth teaspoon soda
Gently fold the molasses and butter, without stirring, till the hard-boiled stage. Stir in the soda and thoroughly mix press the mixture into a shallow greased pan. Smooth the top with a greased spatula. When firm, cut into squares with a sharp knife dipped into water. Cool. Wrap in waxed paper and store in covered container. (If yours is like most families, that last is unnecessary—they'll just go ahead and eat!)
