GOING TO THE U.S.A.?

To avoid possible delay and embarrassment at border crossing points, be sure you have met the foreign exchange requirements before you set out. The travel ration of \$150 per person for the period November 16th, 1948, to November 15th, 1949 is to ensure the fairest distribution of the U.S. funds available. For children under 11 years of age, the amount is \$100 U.S. If you are taking a trip to the United States, you need to secure a Form H permit to take out of Canada for any amount exceeding \$10 U.S. or more than a total of \$25 in U.S. and Canadian Funds. Form H can be secured quickly and easily from branches of any Canadian Bank.

CREAM PRODUCERS' BULLETIN

Consumer reaction against 2nd and 3rd grade butter, since the introduction of a substitute, shows little indication of a market for anything but the best. Good butter has a pleasing taste our competitors have never been able to duplicate. Because this taste appeal is one of butter's biggest selling points, it can only be protected and enhanced by the manufacture of a high quality butter and this can only be made from good clean cream. We cannot afford to jeopardize the butter industry and our own economy by marketing a poor quality butterfat.

To produce good clean cream may we suggest that you:
1. Keep all utensils clean and dry.
2. Milk before cows are fed, particularly turnips and strong feeds.
3. Remove milk and cream from stable odours immediately.
4. Separate in a clean room.
5. Cool each separation of cream in water before mixing with older cream. Stir while cooling.
6. Use clean metal stirring rod.
7. Keep all cream clean and cold.
8. Aim for cream testing 35%.

Let us keep our cream quality high that we may:
(a) realize every cent possible from our butterfat and
(b) increase the consumer demand for our creamery butter.

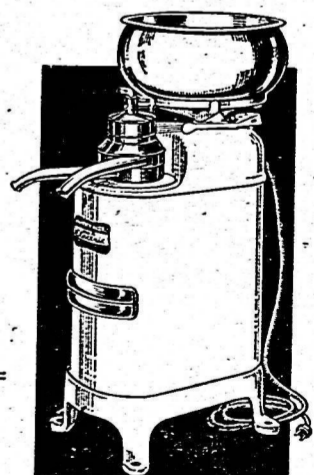
