**Farmers Should Have Some Protection From Fire**  
One of the most disastrous things on a farm is a fire. None of us wants a fire, for that matter; but it is more feared on a farm, where there is no fire protection. We saw the disastrous fire on Friday night. There was nothing that anyone could do, except to stand around and watch the flames and the season's crops eaten up by flames.

An arrangement might also be arrived at with Markdale to have it housed and manned in this community. There are fire trucks equipped with mechanism to pump water from wells and streams and deliver it at great velocity.

The team needs the support of the fans for encouragement, and it needs the revenue from the gates to pay its expenses. Equipping a ball team and maintaining the diamond with proper transportation to the games away from home, entails quite an expenditure.  
The fans who have attended the games are real baseball enthusiasts. Many of them do not get out until 6 o'clock, at which time they hardly have time to supper. Farmers, too, are not likely to get their chores finished and have supper over in time for the games.  
On the other hand, the games must be started early in order to get in seven innings, or at least five, before dark these evenings.  
It looks as if Markdale needs floodlights for the ball games. Floodlights would permit later starting times and make it possible for the game to be played without interference from darkness. Glancing back at the success of the Centennial, it would appear that a campaign to install floodlights in the park for another year ought not to be looked upon as an impossibility. There are many ways in which small amounts of money could be raised to provide the cost of the lights.
