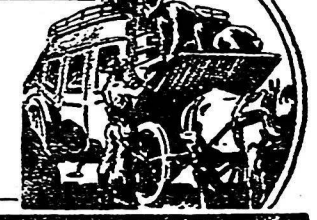

HOW CAN I?

Q. How can I prepare invisible ink?
A. Invisible ink may be mixed by using one teaspoonful of white sugar dissolved in 1/4-cupful of boiling water, or use sweet milk. Write with this in the ordinary manner. Holding to the fire will turn the ink brown so that it may be read, the heating affecting the saccharine matter.

Q. How can I tighten the handle of an umbrella that has become looser?
A. Fill the hole in the handle with powdered resin, heat the rod, and press it firmly into the hole; then lay it aside for a while to set.

Q. How can I boil an egg that is cracked?
A. Add a little vinegar to the water that is used for boiling, and the white of the egg will not boil out.

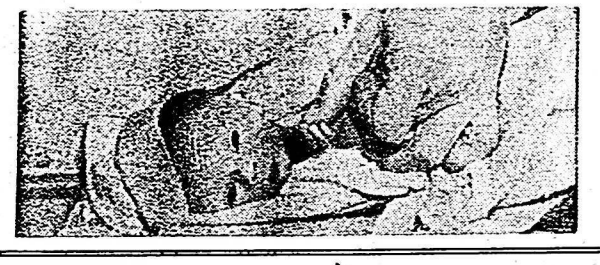
Q. How can I remove an ink stain from a rug?
A. These stains can usually be removed by making a paste of butter-milk and starch, applying and leaving it on for two or three days. Then rinse and dry. Repeat the process if necessary.

Q. Should dates or other dried fruits be washed before using?
A. Yes. Germs collect on them from exposure and handling. Place them in a colander and pour boiling water over them.

Q. How can I prevent sticking of windows due to the weather stripping?
A. Rub a cloth dipped in the paraffin over the stripping. This will leave a smooth track for the window sash.

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New And Useful

Hand-operated grinder-fooder chopper mill features cutter knives of hardened carbon steel. Cuts, rather than crushes, chopped meat. Unit grinds wheat, coffee, barley, rice, cheese, bread crumbs, etc.; cuts raw and cooked meats, potatoes, onion, fruit, etc.

Towel racks, pencil sharpeners or soap dispensers may be attached to glass or metal walls. Section cup is pressed against wall, then bolt in centre of cap is tightened. End of bolt pushes against wall and sets up a tension between it and the cap. Tension strengthens the suction cups against wall and attachment permanently in place.

Stove Has New Features
Electric range being introduced has several unique features, including adjustable lamp which slides up or down, hooding fluorescent light on any desired part of range top; a deep-well cooler with an exclusive designed base, which raises the heating unit, hot or cold, without use of hooks or tongs; warming drawer, placed waist high, with a 1,000-watt thermostatically controlled unit, said to keep rolls, rolls, etc., from drying out at same time it keeps them hot.

Magnetic Pin Bin

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Helpful Hints For Housewives

If you stand your broom or dust mop against a wall or door, try the handle-end with a rubber tip. This will keep the handle from slipping and falling. Also prevents its marring the woodwork.

An old percolator makes an excellent used-fat container. The coffee filter strains fat as it enters. When used again, fat will pour easily from the spout.

If you use oilcloth on your kitchen worktable or pantry shelves, here's a tip that will make it wear longer, especially at the corners where it breaks through first: Lay the cloth on the surface where it is going to be used and mark the corners with a pencil. Cover these pencil marks carefully with wide pieces of adhesive tape. You will be surprised how much more service you will get from the oilcloth.

When you make your baby's overalls, put snaps on the leg seams instead of buttons. Diapers can be changed in a minute by just unsnapping the legs. Overalls are easy to iron, too.

When you unroll a paper shade, it often needs to be cut narrow, care fully measure the width desired. Then, press a thumbtack firmly into the shade, you will find that the tack has made a series of holes about three inches apart along the entire length. Simply follow this handy guideline with your scissors, and the unwanted part snips off in a minute.

If you need extra serving space when guests come, try the go-everywhere ironing board with a piece of cotton or other material. Let the board rest on the ironing board. A famed designer's original, this winter wool has a wide convertible collar.

All-Purpose — Collar cuffs and buttons from neck to hemline are set off with contrasting tone crepe on this go-everywhere ironing board. Mount it on a kitchen shelf with a handy rod. Weighs six ozs., measures 12" x 12". Simple in construction and operation, makes stains.

Reserve a special spot in your refrigerator for the children's after school snacks. When they rush home from classes hungry, they know the food and drinks in that place are theirs without asking. Saves reshuffling of your own supper menu.

Give this idea a try if your ice cubes slide around in the tray: Place a colander in the sink to catch the cubes. No more ready for use.

A soda straw makes an excellent aid for lighting the gas-stove oven. Since the straw is waxed, it burns readily. Furthermore, it is long enough to reach the burner without placing your arm inside the oven.

Here's a way to make attractive, two-tone buttons for the dresses you fashion yourself. Buy two sets of two-eye buttons — a colored set with flat centres, and a white set small enough to fit the holes through both sets of buttons. For a perfect finishing touch, mount an extra pair on earring bases.

When trimming surplus material from the bottom of a garment, slip it over your ironing board, and cut the cutting right there. It is much easier than trying to work it on a table, and it prevents my accidentally cutting into some other part of the garment.

Small holes torn or burned in linoleum are no problem at all of course. We simply melt a bit of wax, crayon the same color as the pattern and pour it into the hole. When this is smoothed over, the spot is almost impossible to find.
