Owen Sound G. and M. Hospital authorities on Monday morning reported that 14-month-old Wayne Eckhardt to be in fair condition after swallowing a safety pin on Saturday morning at his home. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Eckhardt who live in Glenelg Township.

On Saturday morning, Mrs. Eckhardt heard the baby choking and, suspecting that he had swallowed a pin, rushed him to Durham Memorial Hospital. X-rays there showed the safety pin in the baby's pharynx, which it had entered open end first. The boy was later removed to the Owen Sound hospital.

Several X-rays were taken in Owen Sound, the last of which showed the safety pin to be in the stomach. No operation was necessary, and Wayne returned to his home on Monday in good health.

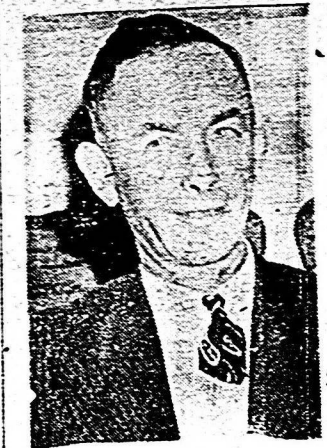
