Mrs. Vaughan was born in Glenelg Township, on the farm now owned by her brother, James Ellison. She was a daughter of the late John and Mary Ellison. She was married to the late Charles Vaughan 65 years ago. They lived on the farm now owned by James Vaughan until 37 years ago, when the family moved to Loreburn, Sask.

The late Mrs. Vaughan was devoted to her home and family. She was a member of the Loreburn United Church.

Surviving are four sons, John and James of Canwood, Sask., William and George of Loreburn, Sask., and three daughters, (Sadie) Mrs. James Ewen of Durham, (Florence) Mrs. Alfred McLelland of Margo, Sask., and (Elizabeth) Mrs. Robert Howat of Loreburn. A daughter, (Mary) Mrs. Thomas Timmins of Glenelg Township, predeceased her. Also surviving are two brothers, Alexander of Loreburn and James of Glenelg Township, and two sisters, (Catherine) Mrs. William Baker and (Mary) Mrs. George Tarry, both of Glenelg. Deceased are two brothers, John and William. There are 25 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

48-Pound Wolf Bagged East of Berkeley Friday

Three shotgun blasts on Friday brought to an end the career of a 48-pound wolf. The animal was shot and killed about two miles east of Berkeley in Holland Township by Wesley Plante of Rock Mills. There were three other men in the party, Walter Akitt, Clayton Betts, and Luther Love.

The men trailed the wolf with two dogs for three and a half hours before they were able to get it within the sights of their guns. The animal, an old one, was put on display in Flesherton on Saturday and created widespread interest.

One spectator described it as looking "exactly like a police dog, except that it is so thin."

The party of hunters first sighted the wolf "days before, but it wasn't until Friday that they were able to bring it down. Farmers in the district had reported losing several sheep, and it was on the basis of these reports that the men organized their hunt.

Passes Away At Rockton Following Heart Attack

Formerly of this district, Mrs. Frank D'Arcy died last Wednesday morning at her home at Rockton, near Guelph. She had suffered a heart attack. Deceased was the former Jane O'Hagan, a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Eugene O'Hagan of Chesepew.
