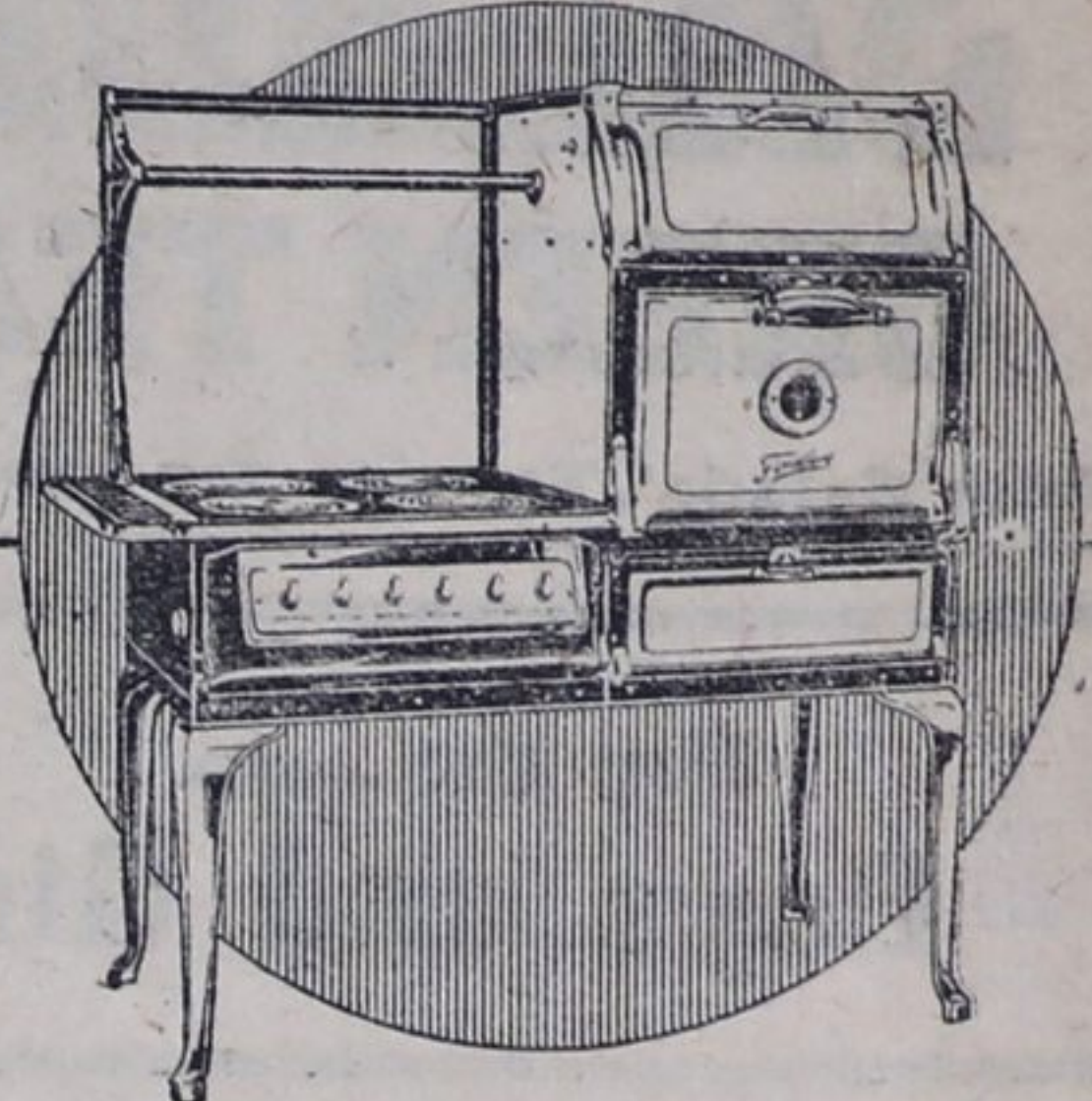
WILL ASK FOR MONEY TO COMPLETE ERECTION OF ARENA BUILDING

Mr. J. A. Legris, who with Mayor Hamilton, was appointed to interview the government in the matter of the completion of the arena building, has been in communication with members of the cabinet at Ottawa and hopes to get an appointment before the session closes. As soon as a date is set, they will go to Ottawa and endeavor to impress upon the Minister of Public Works and the Hon. Ernest Lapointe the necessity of providing enough money to complete such portions of the building as are necessary to prevent any deterioration, if not enough to complete the whole along with the community hall. In accepting the commission, Mr. Legris pointed out to members of the council that it was not an auspicious time to approach the government on the question, as the session is drawing to a close, but he would do

his best to get the appointment and he and Mayor Hamilton hope for some measure of success.
