

## Weird Exhibition of Ball With Silver Centre

Those who missed the picnic at Dawson's Point on Wednesday afternoon were treated to a good substitute at Lakeview Park by the Haileybury and Silver Centre baseball teams, who staged a weird exhibition which the visitors won, 21-17.

Silver Centre scored one in the first, one in the second, one in the third, six in the fifth, two in the sixth, six in the seventh, one in the eighth and four in the ninth for their total, while Haileybury counted four in the first, one in the third, three in the fourth, seven in the sixth and two in the seventh. McCracken started on the mound for the home crew and went along fine until the fifth, when two walks and three hits in a row caused his retirement. He was succeeded by Nottingham, who was warmly greeted by the Silver Centre gang, and was not helped by good fielding behind him. Newkirk started on the hill for the visitors, was relieved by Russ Lemon in the fifth, but had to return to the job when Lemon lost control in the sixth.

Sixteen hits were registered by each team, but Silver Centre had several for extra bases and that about meant the difference in the total score, as both teams were very loose in their fielding.

## Silver Centre Loses One to Cobalt, 8-3

Last Friday evening at Cobalt the Silver Centre ball tossers had one bad frame and allowed the home crew to notch seven tallies, which were plenty to win the ball game. The final count was 8-3.

Silver Centre scored one in the 1st on Arcond's fumble, an out at first and a single to centre. Cobalt got it right back in their half. Franklin, in centre, muffed Cross' high lift, and the runner went all the way to third to score on Dearden's sacrifice fly to left. With two down in the 2nd, Russ. Lemon hoisted one over the fence and failed to touch the bases in going around, but the Cobalters did not know what to do to retire him, and before play was resumed, Lemon went around once more. The visitors added one more counter in the third, again on a fumble by Arcond and a heftily triple to right by Harry Cowden. That ended their counting.

Cobalt's big frame was the 5th. Ferguson started off with a hit which McCann deflected, but could not field. Nadeau hopped one down to second, and with an easy double play in sight, Harry Cowden muffed the second baseman's toss. "Polly" Wink, dug out of retirement by the Cobalters, then crossed up the works by laying down a bunt, which Newkirk did not field in time to get Ferguson at third. Arcond was hit by pitcher, forcing in a run. Ross rolled to second, and was out at first, but another run came in. Cross rolled one to second and the throw home was too late to get the runner. Dearden hit the breeze. Southall punched a single to right and two more runners crossed the plate. McAndrews drew a pass. Ferguson, up for the second time in the inning crashed one off McCann's shins, and accounted for another pair of runs. Nadeau ended the rally by going out, third to first. H. Cowden relieved Newkirk in this frame with none out and the bags loaded, but Newkirk returned to the hill in the sixth and retired the Cobalters in order.

Cobalt played smart ball, and deserved the victory, their second over the Silver Centre crew during the week.

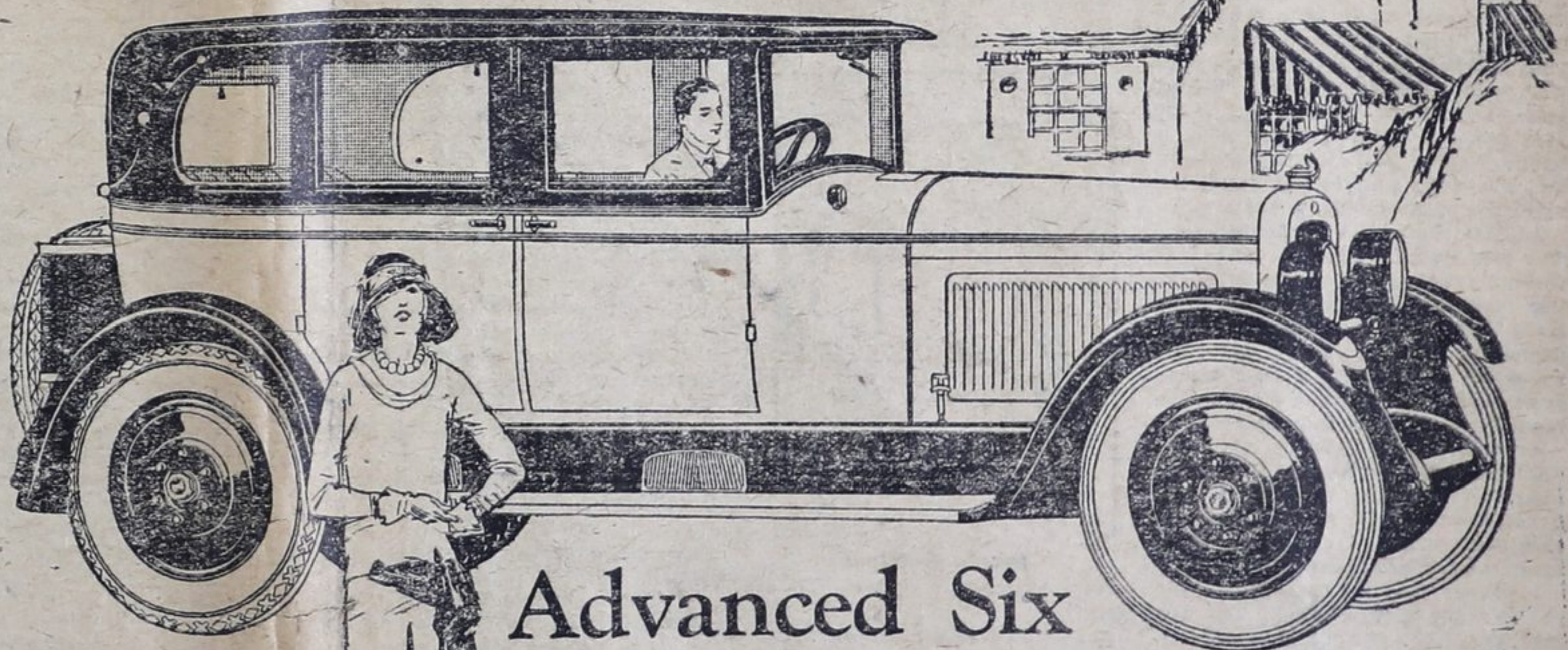
