Another Resident Contributes To Files of The Haileyburian

The thanks of the publishers are extended this week to Milt. Storms for a valuable contribution to the files of The Haileyburian. Through the kindness of readers we have now been able to compile a collection of papers dating from the early days to the time of the fire, but this is by no means complete, and any contributions are always thankfully received.

DUST PREVENTION

During the past week the residents of the Lake Shore Road north have subscribed to a fund to be used to purchase calcium chloride to be applied to Lake Lake Shore north. This cost is being borne by residents of said

section, and no part is being borne by the municipality.

The residents on any street may procure calcium chloride if they are disposed to purchase this material for such use.

Some residents are in favor of using oil instead of calcium chloride, and it has its good points, but some raise objection to it on account of it adhering to the soles of footwear, and thus soiling the floots of houses; another objection is made to the effect it has on tires of motor cars and trucks.

These objections may be trifling and unfounded in fact—I only name them as they have come to my hearing.

Personally, I am convinced after careful enquiry, that the use of calcium chloride not only is a dust preventative, but in addition it saves the surface of the road or street by keeping it from being blown away, by the damp, oily substance it becomes when exposed to the atmosphere, thus forming a surface resembling a sort of rubber, if used systematically for several years on same road or street.

This preparation may also be used on driveways and paths where weeds grow and become a nuisance, by sowing it over the place where such weeds are growing, being careful not to allow it to scatter on any grass or flowers you do not want to destroy.

I would advise all residents to secure all the information they can, either by reading any literature they may be able to secure.
