As a result of two more wins over Timmins, the first on Tuesday of last week by the one-sided score of 10-4, and the second on Monday of this week in Timmins by 6-0, the Falls Eskimos are conceded the championship over Timmins in the northern group of the N.O.H.A. Mr. Marleau is a real pioneer of the North Country and was in Cobalt all through the boom days, and was also in the Porcupine district during the early days of the gold district. To say that interest and activity are maintained all through the Kamiskotia area is to put the matter mildly. Staking is continuing and, what is more to the point from the view of development, exploration work and diamond drilling are being actively carried on. An old resident of Cobalt will be severing his connection with that silver camp next week, when Angus D. Campbell, of the O'Brien staff, takes up his new duties as manager of the Castle-Trethewey mine, Gowganda. Mr. Campbell has been in Cobalt since 1907, and latterly has been assistant manager of the O'Brien and the Mille Lake-O'Brien.

During the years he has lived in Cobalt Mr. Campbell has been prominently identified with sport-

ing events in the camp and also taken an active interest in educational matters and the work of the Masonic Order. In the earlier days of his residence here he played with various hockey teams in the leagues here and also turned out on the baseball diamond. He was one of the organizers of the N.O.H.A. and is a life member both of that association and of the O.H.A. — Northern News.
