## PATRICIA AND KENORA DISTRICTS TO BE MADE ONE BY LEGISLATURE

The district of Patricia, which includes the Red Lake gold mining area, is to be annexed to the district of Kenora by legislation which will be introduced at the present session by Attorney-General Price. The reason for the amalgamation is said to be to provide for litigation and legal matters arising in connection with the mining activity at Red Lake. The only magistrate in Patricia, Earle Lawson, has resigned and the government feels that the reduced population in the district does not provide sufficient work to warrant the appointment of a successor. The amalgamation will transfer all litigation to the town of Kenora, where the land title and other registrations will also be made.

## "GOOSE WOMAN" BASED UPON A REAL CRIME

When Rex Beach wrote "The Goose Woman" he founded the story of an actual murder which stirred the eastern part of the United States about four years ago.

The whole Atlantic seaboard was stirred into a fever heat by the startling disclosures arising from a little New Jersey town. A flock of one hundred newspaper men from New York and other cities spent a period of three months in the town attempting to unravel the mystery. Each had his own theory and no doubt out of the hundred there were those that were right. But none of them could secure sufficient evidence to convince.

Rex Beach had followed the murder very closely and then wrote a novel solving the mystery after his own theory. This has been made into a motion picture and will be shown Friday and Saturday at the Broadway.

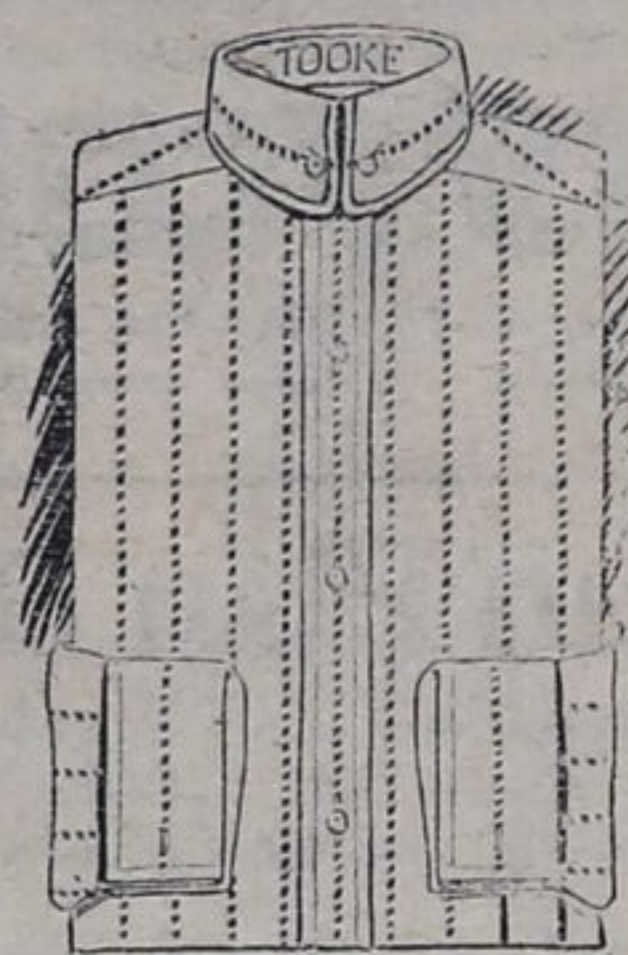
