Youth Drowned Near Aguanico Last Night

A youth of seventeen, named Bigelow, was drowned in Lake Temiskaming opposite the Aguanico mine, some three miles below Haileybury last night. With a companion named Gagnon, he had gone in swimming late in the evening and apparently got beyond his depth. He sank and failed to come up, although, according to those who were in the neighborhood and went to his assistance, the water was only about six feet deep. Neither of the boys was a good swimmer, although they both could swim a

Mr. and Mrs. R. W. Douglas were down the lake in a canoe and were about 500 yards away Some other people were also in the neighborhood and went to the scene as quickly as possible. The Gagnon boy, when he saw his companion sink, called for help, but, as he spoke in French, those who heard him did not understand for a few minutes that anything was amiss. When he called in English, they rushed to the spot and tried, by diving and trolling, to save the Bigelow boy but were unsuccessful as darkness came on almost immediately. Later in the night the body was recovered and was taken to the home of his parents in the neighborhood. Funeral arrangements were not completed this
