**Meets Death in North Particulars are Lacking**

Willie Forget, son of Mr. Wilfrid Forget and a resident of Haileybury for the past twelve years, was killed by a train at Kapuskasing on Friday morning last under circumstances of which relatives here are still without definite news. When word of the tragedy was received the father and two brothers of the unfortunate man caught the afternoon train for Kapuskasing and have not returned.

Mr. Forget had gone to the northern town to work about two and half months ago. He was thirty-four years of age, married and leaves six small children. The funeral was held at Kapuskasing on Saturday, although it was desired by his father and brothers to have the body brought home. This, it is said, was rendered impossible by the terrible way in which the unfortunate man was injured.

Frank Forget, brother of the victim of the tragedy, stated this morning that his father and brothers are expected home tonight.
