Have you allowed yourself or your children to be exposed to this disease through failure to use vaccination as a means of protection? Diphtheria can be prevented by diphtheria immunization. Have you allowed this disease to continue as a menace to the very lives of your children by your failure to have them immunized?

Safe water and pure milk are fundamental needs. Contaminated water and dirty milk are still the cause of much sickness and many deaths. Have you seen to it that the water you and your family drink, and the milk that you use are pure, or do you live with the dangers of impure water and milk hanging over you?

Have you given attention to your home? Are your windows screened to keep out flies? Do the windows open for proper ventilation? Does the sunshine get into your rooms?

A much larger measure of health is within the grasp of most of us, but we must make the necessary effort to seize it. If you delayed last year, if you were careless in health matters, start off this year by doing the things you should do in order to avoid certain diseases and to lead healthier lives.
