## Jury Scores Keeping of Insane at Jails

Demands Better Care for Those Suffering Mentally While Being Transferred

The practice of keeping insane persons at the district jail, following their commitment, until they can be transferred to a proper institution, was scored by a coroner's jury at the investigation held into the death of James Ralph Smith at the jail here on Wednesday night last. The inquiry was held on Thursday afternoon under Coroner Dr. J. W. McCullough, of New Liskeard.

Smith, who was 21 years of age, had been brought to the jail on Monday last from his home in Benoit township, near Bourkes and on Wednesday night about o'clock he was found by the jail guards lying on the floor of his cell with serious injuries. He had apparently struck his head against the bars of the cell and on the floor. The jail physician, Dr. Find Skeleton of Man W. C. Arnold, was called and administered first aid, after which the patient became quieter, but later the doctor was again summoned and Smith died shortly afterwards.

Evidence at the inquest was to effect that Smith had been subject to fits of mental depression



## **District Governor Visits** Haileybury Rotarians

Charles W. Buchanan Gives An Interesting Address on Work of Service Clubs

Haileybury Rotary Club extended a welcome yesterday to Charles W. Bucanan, of Toronto, governor of the 27th Rotary district, who is at present visiting the clubs in his jurisdiction. The regular luncheon was held on Wednesday, instead of Monday, to coincide with the district Governor's visit and there was a good attendance.

Mr. Buchanan, who is accompanied on his tour by Mrs. Buchanan, gave a very interesting address, in which he dealt chiefly with the rapid progress Rotary is making throughout the world. He is a former newspaper man Charles W. Buchanan, Governor and visited this district in that

Mr. Buchanan complimented the local club, not only on the progress that it has made, but on the cleanliness and good looks of the town. This is the most northerly point in Ontario that has a Rotary Club, he said, but he did not find "rough, northern men."

The speaker gave a synopsis of the life of Rotary and its spread throughout the world, until now it is firmly established in fifty-two countries with 3,178 individual clubs, and being organized in three other countries. This year the organization was stressing international service, he said, and all members were asked to submit any ideas along this line that they had. One of the main objects was international peace and to this end there were men working in all parts of the world. He would like to see more clubs formed in the North Country, and he believed that there were other towns where the time was ripe for organization. The local club was advised to build up its membership, that it might become a greater power for good, and the extension of the Rotary movement to other towns would result in improved conditions and a better general understanding a-

Governor Buchanan extended a cordial invitation to all present to visit him when in Toronto, and he was tendered the hearty. thanks of the local club by Presihis address.
