

Lock jaw or Tetanus

The disease Tetanus is commonly called Lockjaw because, when it occurs, the mouth becomes firmly fixed due to the rigid condition of the muscles of the jaw. The disease is caused by a germ whose entrance to the body is usually gained through a wound which tears the tissues of the body or which punctures

The germ of Tetanus has certain peculiarities. It grows best where there is no air, and so it thrives at the bottom of a punctured wound or in the depths of a lacerated wound where the air does not penetrate. This germ belongs to the group of germs which are able to form spores. 
The germ of Tetanus lives in the intestines of cows, horses and the farm, or any wound contaminated by dirt, particularly if the nure, such as street dirt, is very likely to contain Tetanus germs. Any wound made by a nail or other piercing implement is the type of wound favorable for Te-

Tetanus can be prevented. The wound should be properly cared for and, in addition, when there is any suggestion that it is the type of wound in which Tetanus is likely to occur, Tetanus anti-Schmeling-Uzcudun, 15-round toxin should be given. During antitoxin with the result that the
