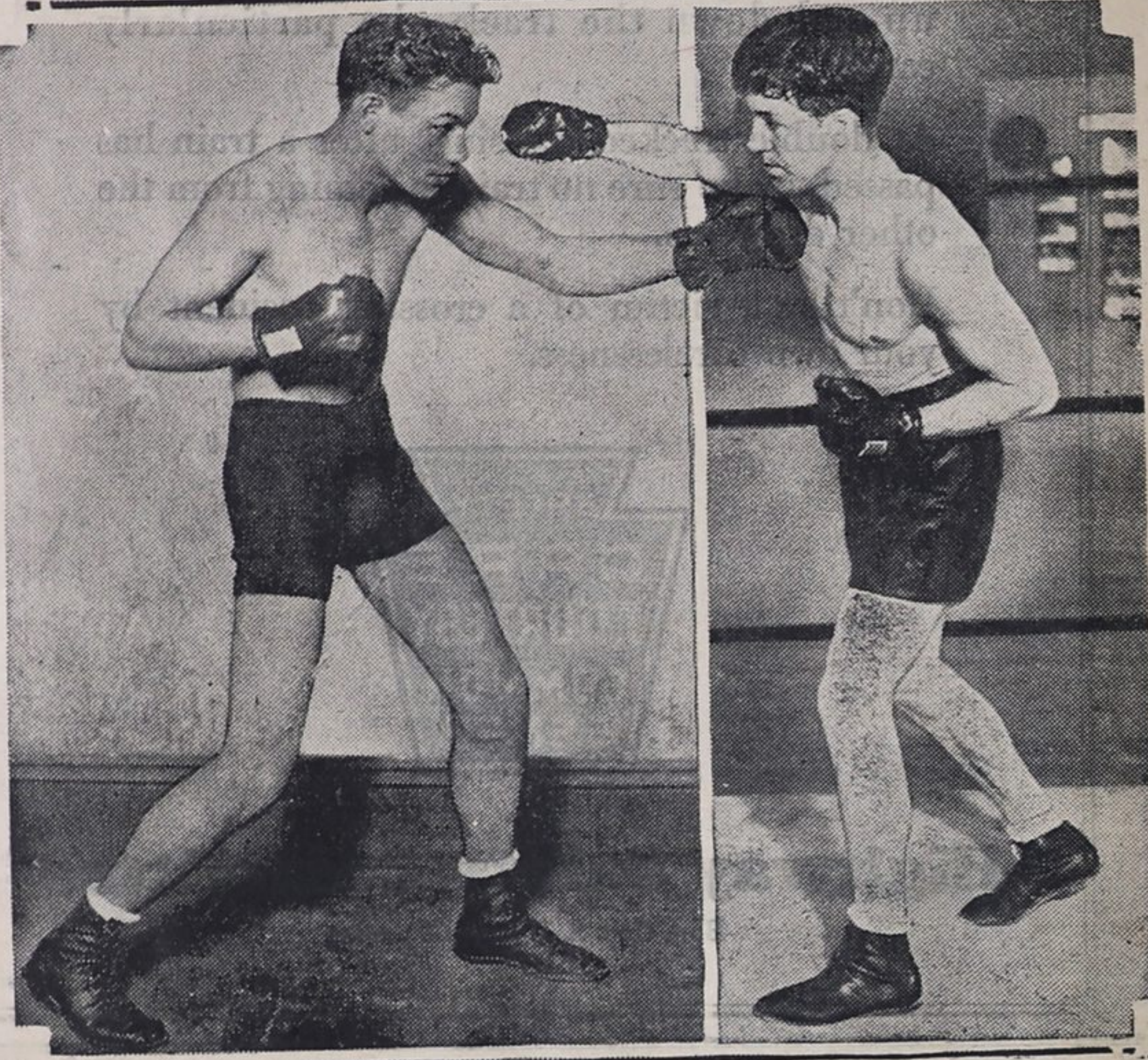


PROMINENT CANADIANS HEAD NEW SOCIETY

ESTABLISH IDENTITY OF SKELETON FOUND ON SHORE OF RIB LAKE

The skeleton found recently on the shore of Rib Lake by T. & N. O. section men has been identified as the remains of Edwin Locke, a former fire ranger and a veteran of the great war, who disappeared nearly three years ago. A rusted revolver found beside the bones, with one chamber empty, leads to the belief that he committed suicide. It was learned at the time of his disappearance that he had been despondent owing to ill health.

Three men returning from a camp on the French River to North Bay on Sunday night encountered such a high sea on Lake Nipissing that they were compelled to cast anchor and spend the night in their launch, in spite of efforts of those on shore, who saw that the craft was in difficulties, to go to their assistance. In the morning they hoisted the anchor and were washed ashore, none the worse for their experience but tired, cold and hungry.
