Northern Ontario Power Company had the approval and endorsement of the soundest electrical experts. Mr. Rodie also paid a tribute to the excellence of the staff of 15 men who were sent out to undertake the construction work. They were a credit to the town and a credit to the Power Corporation, by whom they are employed.

The chairman then called on H. A. Day, of the Publicity Department of Canada Northern Power Corporation, who spoke of the advantages to be derived from the application of electric power both from an industrial and domestic point of view. He spoke of the willingness and desire of the Company to co-operate with the town in advancing its interests and mentioned the opportunity which the Company extended to the residents to become not only customers but also shareholders under the Company's Customer Ownership Plan.
