

What is regarded as a record movement of grain in a few hours was made at the Saskatchewan Wheat Pool Elevator No. 7, the largest and most up-to-date grain elevator in North America, with a capacity of 7,000,000 bushels. In four and a half hours 550,069 bushels of wheat were transferred from the elevator to the hold of the steamship "Lemoyne." There were periods during the loading of the ship when the wheat was carried like a torrential golden river from the elevator at the rate
