OBITUARY

Harry Lew Tong

Harry Lew Tong, a familiar figure in Haileybury for many years, proprietor of two restaurants, died at 2 a.m. on Sunday in the Red Cross Hospital here. He had been in failing health for some time but it was only last Wednesday that he became so ill that he could not move around and he was taken to the hospital. He had been unconscious since Saturday morning and passed away in that state.

Born in China some 45 years ago, the deceased had spent the past thirty years in Canada. Part of this time he lived in Vancouver, later coming east to Fort William and for more than 20 years he has been in the restaurant business in this district, first in New Liskeard and later in Haileybury. He was well known to practically everyone in town, was one of the first three to commence rebuilding his place of business after the big fire in 1922, later acquiring the Empire Cafe, which was run by his eldest son. He was a naturalized Canadian.

Surviving are his widow and a family of four. There are two boys, Harry and Wesley, and two small girls, Nellie and Annie. The elder boy is grown to manhood and will continue the business in one at least of the two restaurants, plans for the future not having been definitely settled yet.

The funeral of the late Mr. Lew Tong was held on Tuesday afternoon from the family home on Ferguson Avenue. Service was conducted by Rev. D.A. MacKeracher, Pastor of the United Church, and interment was in Mount Pleasant Cemetery.

Charles Brooks

Brooks, which took place at his home in New Liskeard this week. He was one of the old residents of that town and well known in the district for many years. TWO APPEALS MADE TO COURT OF REVISION AGAINST ASSESSMENT

Only two appeals were entered for the annual Court of Revision, which was held in the council chambers on Friday evening last, October 25th. Both were against the assessment of unoccupied lands in the municipality, and in neither case was any reduction allowed by the court.

The appellants in the first case were the Hudson's Bay Company which owns two vacant lots, one on Main Street adjoining the Norfolk & Rochester Hardware Company, and the other near the upper end of Broadway Street. The former property is assessed at \$2750 and the latter at \$200.

The other appeal was lodged by the Fennessy Estate, through Attorney John Shine, of Sault Ste Marie, Mich., against the assessment of \$3,000 on the property at the Hotel property, which consists of three lots on Ferguson Avenue. Both appeals were made by letter and the court had a short session.

No Further Light on Tragedy at Cobalt

Victims of Shooting Buried and Inquest Will be Resumed this Afternoon

No further light has been shed on the tragedy which shocked Cobalt and the surrounding district last Friday night, when two well known young people were found fatally wounded, lying in the open near the south end of the town. The dead are Gertrude Viola Sopha, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Burt Sopha, old and respected residents of the town, and Ralph Walker, 22-year-old bank clerk, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Walker, of Ottawa.

An inquest was opened on Saturday afternoon and, after the formal proceedings, was adjourned until this afternoon.

Coroner Dr. Arnold, of Haileybury, has charge of the inquiry and a jury of twelve men was empanelled. This week one of the jurors, A. D. Kerr, asked to be relieved of the duty, as he had received the offer of a job in the Red Lake district and, on the consent of the Crown Attorney, F. L. Smiley, K.C., was allowed to go and the other eleven will form the jury.

Information secured by the police, acting under Inspector Moore, is to the effect that on the night of the tragedy the young people had gone out for a walk, had visited for a short time at the home of the Misses Creighton and had then apparently gone on to the scene of the tragedy. It was thought that a couple of hours had elapsed between the time of the shooting and the discovery of the dying couple by R. E. Roberts, who was passing by and heard groans. Miss Sopha died as she was being carried into the hospital and Walker died some ten hours later. Both had been shot in the head and a bank revolver was found near the body of the young man.

The funeral of Miss Sopha, who was twenty-three years of age, was held on Monday afternoon. The funeral service was conducted in St. James' Church, Cobalt, by Rev. H. F. Cocks, and was attended by a great number of friends and acquaintances of the family. Interment was made in Mount Pleasant Cemetery here. There was a great profusion of floral tributes which testified to the esteem in which the deceased was held and the sincere sympathy which went out to the sorrowing family.

Mr. and Mrs. Sopha came to Cobalt many years ago from Hastings County, Ont. Mr. Sopha has been town foreman for a long period and the family is well known and highly respected.

Miss Sopha was to have been confirmed in St. James' Church on Sunday next when the Bishop of Algoma visits this part of the diocese.

The body of Ralph Walker was shipped to his home in Ottawa on

Sunday evening for burial. His aged father, on hearing that his son was injured, came up from the Capital. The boy was dead before his arrival and the father was grief-stricken as he returned with the body.

Another son, Cecil Walker, and his wife and child, after hearing the news late Friday night, motored down from Timmins, but they, too, arrived after the boy had died.
