### Service Cut Off and Flood Caused When Truck Hits Hydrant

The breaking of a hydrant at the corner of Georgina and Albert Street on Tuesday was responsible for a portion of the south end of town being without water from 9.30 in the morning until 5 p.m. The break was caused by a motor truck, in charge, it is reported, of a green driver, who backed up against the hydrant and snapped it off below the ground. There was quite a flood as a result and the water main on Meridian Avenue had to be shut off in order that the damage might be repaired. The truck is owned by A. G. Brooks, of New Liskeard, plastering contractor, who is doing some work in town. It was necessary to install a new hydrant and the town council, meeting that evening, directed that a bill for the damage be sent to the owner of the truck. It was stated that the price of a hydrant is about \$78.00.

### Stove's Glow Causes False Alarm of Fire

On Friday evening at about 6.30 the fire brigade responded to what turned out to be a false

alarm of a fire at the T. & N. O. freight office. The office had been closed for the night and the coal stove, which heats the building, had been left with the door open, a practice that is often followed to prevent the fire from burning out. Some boys passing at a short distance, saw the reflection of the firelight, went to the residence of the agent, Mr. Belanger and told him that the office was on fire. He called the brigade before going to the scene himself and the men had the run for nothing.
