Samples of ore from Peru, South America, shipped to Haileybury to be assayed would appear to be a peculiar feature of the times, but this was the case this week when J. W. N. Bell, of the Haileybury Assay Office, received a shipment consisting of 1100 pounds of samples. The lot is being assayed for gold, copper, silver, lead and zinc and has been sent on by operators in a South American mining district, passing by many large assay offices en route.

Mr. Bell would not say under what circumstances the fame of the Haileybury Assay Office had reached the southern mining fields, but he is busy on the job and will in time submit a definite report on the samples sent.

Gets Three Months For Theft of Coat at Matabanick Hotel

One Charles McGray, who, it is stated, is known in police circles in this district, was on Monday sentenced to three months in jail for the theft of a mackinaw coat, the property of W. Boys, a salesman from St. Thomas, from the Matabanick Hotel here on Thursday last. The coat was taken from a hook in the hallway of the hotel, according to Mr. Boys, and later recognized by him in a second hand store in Cobalt, where it had been sold by the pilferer. With the aid of Cobalt police and provincial officers, the offender was found in a Queen Street boarding house in the silver town and pleaded guilty to the theft. He could not give any information about an order book that had been in the pocket of the coat and this is still missing. It is stated that McGray was under the influence of what is generally known as "canned heat" at the time of his arrest.
