

Under the Lands and Forests Department there are two Crown Timber Agents, located at New Liskeard and North Bay, respectively, and each drawing a salary of \$2500 per annum. Crown Lands agents are stationed at Cochrane, Powassan, Markstay, Mattawa, New Liskeard, Sudbury, North Bay, Matheson, Hearst and Sturgeon Falls. They receive from \$500 to \$1300 each for a total of over \$9,500, while homestead inspectors at Chelmsford, New Liskeard, Callander, Cache Bay, Kapuskasing Cochrane, Monteith and Englehart, cost \$13,500 in salaries.


