

New Timetable Now in Effect on T. & N.O.

Principal Change is in South Bound Trains; Earlier Mail to Toronto

The new summer timetable went into effect on the T. & N.O. Railway on Sunday last with the chief changes applying to the southbound evening trains. In these No. 2, the Continental Limited, arrives in Haileybury at 4.21 instead of 5.10, a difference of 49 minutes, while No. 46 for Toronto is 22 minutes later, reaching here at 6.23, instead of 6.01. The latter train reaches North Bay at the same hour as formerly, 10.15, while No. 2 arrives in that city at 8.10 o'clock instead of 9.00. No. 18, which on the previous schedule was due at Haileybury at 1.21 p.m., arrives here at 1.18.

There are only slight changes in the northbound trains here. No. 47 is due two minutes later, at 10.52 a.m., while No. 1 arrives one minute earlier, at 2.11. No. 17, previously arriving at 3.30, has been speeded up and reaches here at 3.28.

Some complaints are heard by the people of Timmins, where the earlier time of the Continental makes it necessary to have mail for Toronto ready at 9.30 a.m. They also find fault with the taking off of the cafe car from No. 47 at Swastika, and the Board of Trade and other organizations are taking the matter up with the Commission.

So far as the service at Haileybury is concerned there appear to be no complaints. Mail for Toronto will have to be posted almost an hour earlier, but there will be little further change in conditions under the new schedule.

NORTHERN TELEPHONE COMPANY WILL BUILD NEW LINE TO HEARST

The Northern Telephone Company has been awarded the contract for the building of the long distance line from Kapuskasing to Hearst, the work to be completed by August 1st this year. The distance is some 60 miles and the line is being put in by the T. & N.O. Commission, which already has long distance connection to Kapuskasing. The Telephone Company will also install a central system at Hearst, where a vote on the granting of a franchise was taken on April 28th, and where already they have applications for some 40 phones.

The town of Hearst will be connected by wire with outside points, an improvement that will be greatly appreciated. In the voting there were 66 ballots cast in favor of the franchise, with only four against.

The Northern Development Committee of the Toronto Board of Trade will be in this section on Friday, May 9th, next, when they will visit points of interest in Cobalt and Haileybury and will be entertained at a banquet in New Liskeard that evening. Hon. Chas. McCrea and Hon. Wm. Finlayson will be with the party.

The sum of \$918 was stolen from the vault of the branch of the Royal Bank at Smooth Rock Falls last week and latest reports are to the effect that no clue to the identity of the thief has been found. The provincial police have the matter in hand.

HAILEYBURIAN RELAY RACE TO BE HELD ON SATURDAY, MAY 31st

The Haileyburian relay race, inaugurated last year and expected to be held as an annual event for boys in the district under the age of nineteen years, is to be held this year on Saturday, May 31st, at 2.30 p.m.

The conditions governing the race will be the same as last year and copies of the rules will be forwarded this week to the various towns in the district, with entry form blanks.

The course will be slightly altered this year. Instead of having the start and finish of each relay at the corner of Main and Ferguson, the post will be moved to the corner of Browning and Ferguson, two blocks north, and it is believed that this will lessen the strain on the boys making the spurt at the finish, as the grade here is not as great as at the spot where the changes were made in last year's race.

Enquiries have been received from several of the towns which had teams in last year's event, and interest among the boys is keen. We hope to have everything in readiness for the comfort of the runners and for the proper handling of the race when the time comes.

Entries will close on Tuesday, May 27th.

Town of Elk Lake Has Heavy Loss by Fire

Two Dwellings and Community Hall Razed With Loss of Ten Thousand

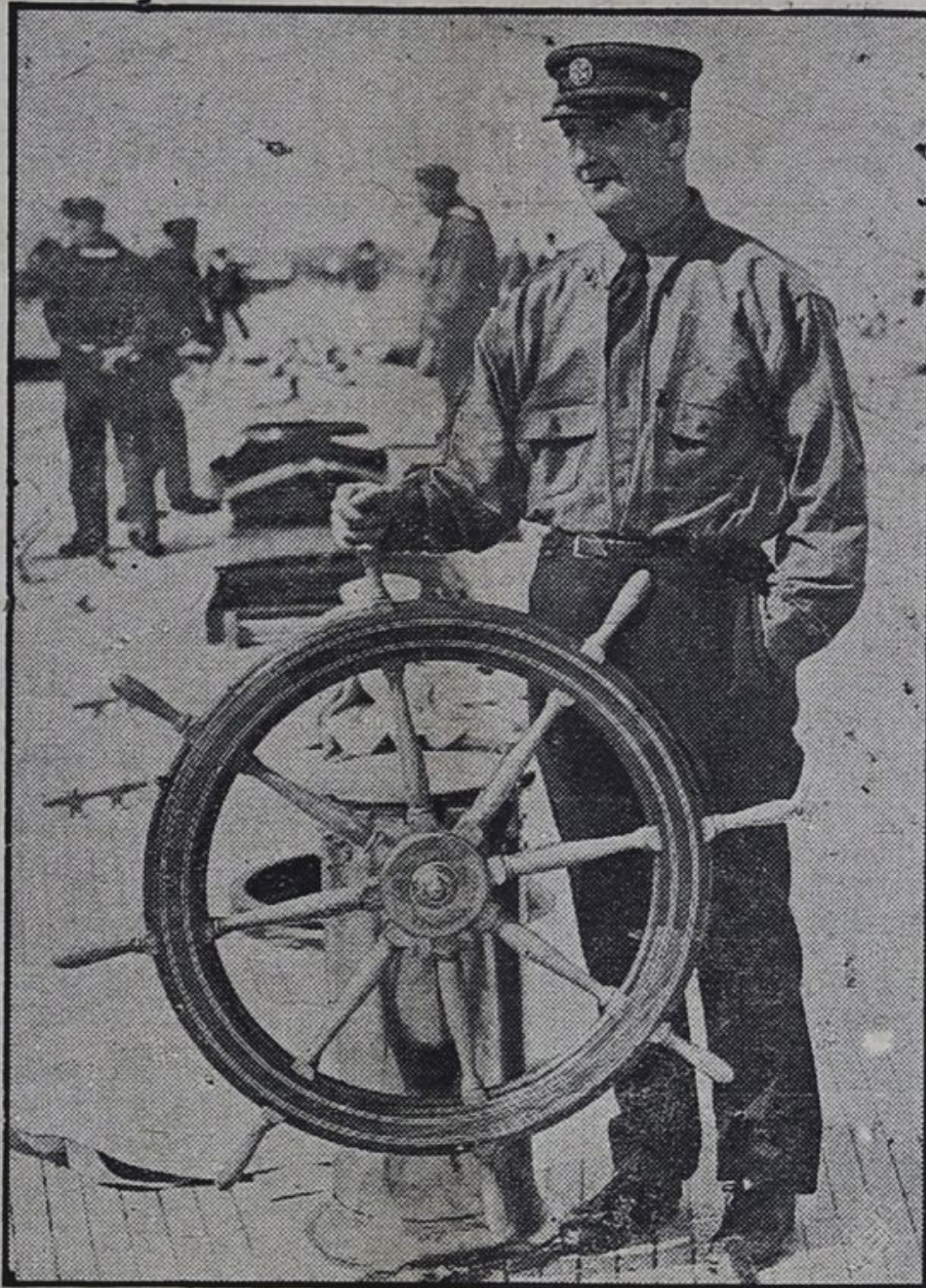
The town of Elk Lake was visited by a rather bad fire on Friday morning last, when two dwellings and the community hall were totally destroyed with a loss that is estimated at around \$10,000. The fire broke out at 8 a.m. in a double house owned by O. Rivers and W. Peters, spread to the home of S. Ploudard nearby and from there to the community hall. With the aid of neighbors,

the occupants of the houses were able to save some of their furniture and effects, but their losses are heavy.

The fire was fought by the volunteer brigade, using a portable gasoline pump, and men and equipment from the Ontario Forestry Branch were on the job, but while the flames were kept from spreading further, it was impossible to save any of the buildings involved. At about 10 o'clock the fire was well under control.

Elk Lake has been particularly unfortunate in the matter of fires during the past few years, and the loss of the community hall, a building owned by the Women's Institute, will be keenly felt.
