

Haileybury in 1923

Items from the Files of The Haileyburian of Seven Years Ago

Five applications for building permits in the downtown section were approved by the town council this week. E. Dabous and R. Abraham will build stores on Ferguson Avenue. A. Shroff plans a tailor shop on Main Street, Thos. Breen is erecting a warehouse near the lake and R. Bruce will build a hotel on Broadway.

Following a visit of the chief architect of the Provincial Department of Public Works, it is announced that the rebuilding of the court house and the public and separate schools will be commenced very shortly.

The Ontario Forestry Department is commencing the clearing of the second growth and brush from the hills west of the T. & N. O., as a preventive measure from a recurrence of the big fire which destroyed the town last fall.

Curtains on an open window at the home of Mr. and Mrs. H. Pudden, blowing out with the wind, were ignited by a spark from a neighbor's chimney and the blaze caused damage to the amount of \$25 before the fire brigade arrived on the scene.

Several cases of frozen pipes were reported on May 9th, as a result of the sudden drop in temperature. Some were temporary lines laid above the ground, while others were the regular water services in homes.

Though hunted by Provincial officers, Leo Rogers, accused of the murder of Constable Fred Lefebvre, is still at large, and no definite clues have so far been

found that tend to lead to his arrest.

Tuesday, May 22nd, marked the opening of navigation on Lake Temiskaming, when the Steamer Temiskaming arrived in port at 10 a.m. The Meteor came in during the afternoon.

The relief fund being raised in Haileybury for the sufferers in the town of Cochrane, owing to the epidemic of typhoid there, has reached a total of \$538.00.

It has been definitely decided that the new district jail will be built at the corner of Main Street

and Georgina Avenue.

Wellington Hay, Liberal leader in the Legislature, will be in Haileybury on June 4th, in the interests of Henry O'Grady, candidate for the coming election.
