**NARROW ROADWAY ON LAKE SHORE BLOCK NO PARKING AREA**

The Haileyburiian has been requested by Chief of Police MacGirr to give publicity to the fact that parking of motor cars is forbidden on the Lake Shore Road between Probyn and Florence Street. Signs have been erected there this week and this rule is to be strictly enforced, according to the chief.

It is pointed out that By-law No. 729, which was passed after being submitted to the Depart-

ment of, Highways and approved by that body, vests "Absolute control of street traffic" in the police and that the lack of width on the highway in the block specified, makes the ban on parking a necessary proceeding in the interests of public safety. The by-law contains many clauses that cover all phases of the traffic problem and motorists would do well to become familiar with it.
