Sanford assisted in the recruiting of various units and in the beginning of 1916 was granted a billet as a senior subaltern in the 159th Regiment. With many others he contracted pneumonia while training in a damp skating rink in North Bay, but gradually began to regain strength during the regiment's sojourn at Camp Borden. Unfortunately he was ordered overseas in the early fall of that year and had not been long overseas, in the raw autumn weather of the British Isles, when he was again attacked with pneumonia, from the effects of which he only partly recovered and was returned to Canada a hundred per cent. disability. In spite of his condition, he took his share in the life of the community and for thirteen years "carrie" on" in his little home in Elk Lake, winning the love and esteem of his fellow citizens, by his unfailing cheerfulness and optimism. In the early days of the war he had married Miss Claire Holtom; and his wife and young son, Norman, made up the little household. He lived to see his son reach the age of fourteen


